## Alexander Mack Descendant by Gerald Linerode

I am Gerald Linerode of Stark Co., OH and I am researching my Linerode family as you are your Mocks. My brother ran into one of your Mock working charts on Ancestry.com for the **Alexander Mack** Family. The chart showed the following: **Alexander Mack**, b. 1771, Franklin County, PA., d. 31 Aug. 1823, m. ca 1793 **Catherine Baker**, b. 23 Feb. 1773, d. 2 Feb. 1853. Son **John Mack**, b. 23 Jun 1794, d. 4 May 1859, m. **Catherine Aufrance** (widow). The two daughters of John and Catherine Mack were listed as: **Caroline Mack**, d. age 6 and **Roseana Mack** m. **Milford Liverode**. This Milford Liverode is a misread or misspelled Milford **Linerode** and I have your Roseana Mack spelled **Rosanna S. Mock**. Rosanna was born in Dec 1856 and died 4 Jun 1940. Milford was born in April 1852, Tuscarawas County, Ohio a son of **Charles Linerode** and **Mary Stamm**. He died 18 Mar 1934, Bethlehem Twp., Stark Co., Ohio. Milford's mother Mary died 1 Jun 1852, age 30 y, 7 m, 26 d. As you see, she lived only a short time after the birth of Milford.

Charles married second time to a ward and cousin, Catharine Deardorff on 24 Nov 1853, the same day that he sold several pieces of land. He had acquired land in Whiteside Co., Illinois and removed there no later than 1854. His brother Isaac Deardorff Linerode moved west with him. Charles died there 25 July 1857 of typhoid fever.

With death of both of the natural parents, Milton and his siblings were separated, possibly since he was so young, he was returned to Stark County. Actually I have no proof he ever went to Illinois though the rest were all raised there.

Rosanna's uncle and aunt, **David** and **Rosanna Mack/Mock** raised Milton as their own and left the farm to him.

The younger Rosanna's father, John, had died and her guardian **Henry Baker** signed for her when she married Milford on 17 Jun 1874.

Milford and Rosanna had twins, **Callen A.** and **Stella J. Linerode**, b. 12 Mar 1875. Callen d. 19 Mar and Stella d. 22 Mar 1875. They are buried in Blough/Blough Cemetery.

I have found here in Stark County, a distant cousin **Eleanor M. Linerode Alexander**. Eleanor is descended from Milford and Rosanna, through their son William H. then through William's son Oscar. She does have more than I since this is her direct line. Most fortunate for Eleanor is her great-grandmother Rosanna kept a photo album in which she recorded the names on the back of the photos.

One photo she has is of Catharine Layman Aufrance Mock, holding daughter Rosanna who is no more than a year old. This is on glass. One is a tin type of Milton and Rosanna on their wedding day. One of family when children, William and Elva A., are small and one of family when kids are 35 or so.

Interesting that Milford's grandfather and great-grandfather Linerode had lived a number of years in Franklin County, PA. as did the Mack family.

## Davidson Co., North Carolina Burials Middleton Methodist Church

These burials are copied from some papers of Dr. William Mann who did considerable research on the North Carolina Mocks quite a number of years ago. I find it interesting that most early Mocks usually belonged to the Lutheran or Reformed Church and a few the Moravian, Mennonite, Dunkard and other churches, but this is a large group of Mocks in Midway, Davidson Co. who are buried in a Methodist Episcopal Church Cemetery.

From Steve Lapp:

Adam Mock, son of Jacob, became very active in the Methodist Church at Midway. In the Feb. 1993 issue of MFH, pg 1-4, Barbara Dittig quoted portions of *Records of the Moravians in N.C.* Both Jacob and his son Adam are mentioned, as well as the Methodists. I believe Adam may even have been a minister of that church. Apparently some of Jacob's family became Moravians and some became Methodists. This created some discord in the community, which was controlled to a large extent by the Moravians. On March 16, 1834 Juliana Kappus Mack was buried by the Moravians in the Lutheran graveyard, the Lutheran Church there was no longer active. Two years later her husband, Jacob was buried in the Moravian cemetery at Friedberg

## Surry Co., North Carolina Tax Lists

Surry County was formed from Rowan County in 1771. From 1771 through 1778 Surry Co. records covered the present day counties of Allegheny, Ashe, Forsyth, Stokes, Surry, Wilkes and Yadkin. From 1777 to 1787 it covered present day Forsyth, Stokes, Surry and Yadkin.

These tax records proved helpful for researching the Mocks, McBrides, Blacks and Poindexters who were all in this area early on.

## Henry Mock of Rowan Co. North Carolina

This weekend while helping my Grandmother clean out "stuff" we found a brief Family Tree done by one of James Henry Coley and Mary Margaret Mock's daughters that says Mary Margaret was born in Washington County, VA and that Henry Mock of Washington County, VA died in 1847 of Typhoid fever. Henry Mock would have been her Grandfather. Another piece of the puzzle maybe This is what I have to date on this family.

I. George Washington Sheek b. 26 Oct 1787 Rowan (now Davie) Co., NC.; d. 13 Mar 1867 Davie Co., NC, bur. in Whitaker Cem.; m. (1st) 22 Nov 1809, Davie Co., Mary Margaret Call. They had the following children:

i. Daniel A. Sheek b. 11 Apr 1812; d. 23 Jul, bur. Macedonia Moravian Cem., Davie Co., NC

ii. John Bryant Sheek (1817-1889)

iii. Richmond George Sheek (1819-1896)

v. Susanna Sheek b. 8 Jul 1825 Rowan (now Davie) Co. NC; d. 10 Feb 1922 Davie Co., NC; bur. Macedonia Moravian Cem, Davie Co. NC; m. 18 Apr 1844 Davie Co., NC. Their marriage bond filed in NC State Archives. Henry Mock d. Washington Co., VA 1847 of Typhoid Fever. Their children were:

From the book, "The History of the Sheek Family 1753-1973" by Ann Ellis Sheek, I found the following:

Susanna Sheek was born 7/8/1825 in Rowan County, the only daughter of George and Peggy Sheek. On April 18, 1844 she married Henry Mock. They moved to Virginia and had two children, William (Will) Mock b. 1845 possibly Washington Co., VA and Mary Margaret Mock b. Feb. 1848 Washington Co., VA. Margaret married James Coley. Henry died in Virginia when the children were small. Richmond Sheek, Susanna's brother, rode one horse and led another to Virginia and brought Susie and her two children home to Davie County. They each held a child in front of them on the horses.

.....Mrs. Kennen told me the information on Susanna's early married life in Virginia and about the Cook family trip to Indiana. She told me this in June, 1971" pg. 31. Mrs. Kennen is Queen Bess Sheek Kennen daughter of George Leven Sheek.

Any information on Henry or his son, William would be greatly appreciated.

According to the MFH "Working Chart" #19B for Peter Mack and Barbara Martin, Henry, Eliza Jane and William B. are siblings and children of Peter Mock III and Mary "Polly" Binkley and grandchildren of Henry A. and Catherine Black Mock. No information has been given for Henry Mock who was thought to have been born ca 1823 and died young. Liza Jane Mock b. 1826, m. 1st \_\_\_ Cope; William B. Mock, b. 18 Mar 1828 VA; m. 1850 Delilah Smith Mock.

Mary Mock, a possible daughter of Henry A., though not listed on his probate, is listed married to \_\_\_ Sheek.

This all leads me to think this Henry must be connected to the Peter Mack/Barbara Martin family and very possibly the son of Peter Mock III and Mary "Polly" Binkley Mock.

Mauck, born 13 Mar 1841, served in Company "C", 70th Indiana Regiment, in the Civil War, m. (1) 17 Dec 1863, Ellen M. Dawson, resided at Strawn, KS. Ellen died in 1871. Two children. This would make Anthony the second of 13 children of Frederick Mauck of Harrison Co., Ind. and Farleigh S. Mauck the eldest of Anthony Mauck 4 children.

Strawn, was born in Indiana in 1841, and lived in his native State until 1868, and came to Kansas, and located in California Township, Coffey County, and has been engaged in farming and stock-raising. Mr. Mauck was married in Indiana, in 1864, to Miss Ellen Dawson, who was born in Indiana. They had two children, William F. and Anthony M. He lost his wife in 1871, and married again in 1875 to Miss Margaret Hoover. They have three children, Jessie H., Isaac H. and John L. Mr. Mauck is a member of the G. A. R. He enlisted in 1861, in the Thirty-eighth Indiana Volunteer Infantry and served twenty-two months, and was wounded at Perryville, Ky., and was discharged on account of disability."

**Abraham Mack**, son of **Alexander \***, in his time was a prominent farmer at Cherryville, Northampton County. He was born 8/14/1798, and died on 2/19/1853. He was married to **Elizabeth Grave**, born 12/23/1801, and died 8/7/1851.

**John C. Mack** a son, was born near Cherryville, 4/17/1840, and his parents having died while he was still quite young he was employed for a number of years on a farm and also in Faber's Mill, near Howertown. In 1859 he went to Mauch chunk and learned the tinsmith trade, which he followed until the Civil War broke out and then, on the 8th day of August, 1862, he enlisted in Co. F, in the 132d Regiment, PA Volunteer Infantry, and participated in the Battles of Antietam, Fredericksburg, and Chancellorsville. He was mustered out of service on 5/26/1863, and returned to Mauch chunk, but later went to Hazelton. .... He was married, on 9/22/1865, to **Sarah A. Remaly**, a daughter of **John and Lovina (Wert) Remaly**, of Washington township, and they had four children: **Dr. John S Mack**; **J. William Mack**, slate manufacturer at Slatington; **Dr. Charles B. Mack**, resident physician of the Germantown hospital; and **Minnie E. Mack**, who died when five years old. They were devoted members of the Reformed Church.

**Dr. John S. Mack**, physician and surgeon at Slatington, was born there 6 May 1870. He graduated from the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy in 1887, and from the University of Pennsylvania in the class of 1890, then located in his home town, where he has been exceptionally successful in securing a large practice. When the Spanish-American War broke out, he was appointed an assistant-surgeon of the United States Army, and assigned to the Fourth regiment, under Colonel Pettit, who was stationed at Manzanillo, in Cuba, with the rank of a first lieutenant. He was in the service for six months, then owing to sickness he was compelled to resign and upon receiving his honorable discharge, returned to Slatington and resumed his practice with great success. .... **Dr. Mack** married 31 Jan 1889, to **Catharine Williams**, daughter of **Evan J. and Ellen (Williams) Williams**, and they had three children: **Maud G Mack**, **John S. Mack** (who died in infancy), and **Helen C. Mack**.

**J. William Mack**, son of **John C.**, and **Sarah A. (Remaly) Mack**, is a slate manufacturer at Slatington. He was born in that borough 7/4/1873. Mr. Mack was married on Sept. 22, 1897, to **Laura J. Griffith**, daughter of **Richard and Margaret (Williams) Griffith**, of Lansford, Carbon County, and they have two children: **Richard Griffith**, and **Sarah Ellen**.

## MACK FAMILY (ALLENTOWN)

**John Jacob Mack and his wife, Margaret Kurtz \***, natives of Germany, came to America in May, 1853. He was born at Neckerteunsling\*, province of Wurtemberg\*, in 1792. Mrs. Mack was born at the same place and died at Philadelphia, one week after landing in Pennsylvania. There he remained for about six months, when he settled on a farm of about 125 acres at what is now Mount Cobb. Lackawanna County, Pa. In Germany he was a transportation merchant, an energetic, and ambitious citizen of an ingenious turn of mind. He was affiliated with the Lutheran Church. Their children were: 1) **John Christian Mack**, a cobbler by trade, who settled in Philadelphia; 2) **Frederica\* Mack (Mrs. Frederick Doernach)**; 3) **John Jacob Mack**, a farmer born in 1822, still living near Mount Cobb (1913). 4) **John Michael Mack**; 5) **Margaret Mack (Mrs. Joseph Zeiler)**; 6) **Frederick Mack**, a cabinet maker by trade, lives in Connecticut.

**John Michael Mack**, son of **John Jacob and Margaret (Kurtz) Mack**, was born 12/16/1824 in Germany. He was educated in the common schools and at an early age was a teamster for his father. He came to America with his parents and became a farmer, succeeding to his father's homestead in Jefferson township, which he successfully cultivated until his decease.

He served as a private in the Civil War, with the PA drafted militia from September, 1864, until the close of the war. In politics he was a Republican; and served as a school director for several years in Jefferson township. He was an active member of the Evangelical Church, serving it as a trustee, steward, class-leader, and exhorter. He was an exceedingly kind hearted man, and was very popular and highly esteemed citizen. He died 27 Oct 1880 and was buried at Mount Cobb. He married in Feb 1855, **Christina Louise Laiblin\***, a daughter of **Christian and Christina (Reed) Laiblin**, natives of Schoendorf, Wurtemberg, Germany.

**Christian Laiblin** was a professor and the principal of Schoendorf. He had a family of three sons and two daughters, who were all well educated. Two sons were professors and the third was a wholesale dry goods merchant. One daughter married a Mr. Schoenly, a baker. **Christina L. (Laiblin) Mack** was born 19 Nov 1828\*, and died 11 Jun 1890 and was interred at Mount Cobb, by the side of her husband.

Issue: **Mary Louise**; **William C.** of Brooklyn, NY; **Charles William** of San Diego, CA; **Carolina M.\*** married **Rev. D. G. Reinhold**; **Harper** died at age 5; **John M.**; **Joseph S.**; **Augustus F.**, of San Diego Cal; **Lillian F.**, died aged 14 years.

## Joseph Mock of Adams Co., Illinois

Joseph Mock who carries on general farming on section 4, Chili Township, is a native of Kentucky, his birth having occurred on the 5th of April 1835 in Bourbon County. His parents, Abraham and Cynthia (Wilson) Mock were also natives of that state and the father was of German and French descent. Their family numbered six children, three sons and three daughters; Emily now the wife of E. Rice, Samuel who died in 1859; Joseph of this sketch; Henry; Margaret, wife of John Robinson and Cynthia, wife of Cain Hummel. The father of this family followed the vocation of farming, and both he and his wife always resided in their native State.

Joseph Mock was reared under the parental roof in the normal manner of farm lads. Through the winter he attended the subscription schools which were held in a log schoolhouse, three miles from his home. In the summer he worked upon the farm. He was only 11 years of age at the time of his father's death, and thus early in life he was cast adrift upon the world to make his own way as best he could. He began earning his livelihood by work as a farm hand, receiving \$5 per month for his services. He continued his residence in Kentucky until 1851, when he came to Adams Co., IL. During the succeeding eleven years of his life he engaged in farming in that locality, and in 1862 he came to Hancock County locating upon land in Chili Township, which he had previously purchased. This was an eighty acre tract on section 4, and though wild and unimproved he soon transformed it into rich and fertile fields. He now owns one hundred and twenty acres of valuable land, and his place is well improved with all modern accessories and conveniences.

In 1862, Mr. Mock was united in marriage with Miss Eleanora Kennedy, daughter of Charles and Cornelia (Gates) Kennedy. The lady was born in Ohio, on the 23rd of January, 1834. Three children graced the union of Mr. and Mrs. Mock, namely: Elmer, who now carries on farming in Chili Township; Ona, at home; and Wilson, who died July 28 1884. The first-named married Theresa Cunningham.

Since attaining his majority, Mr. Mock has been a supporter of the Democratic party and its principles, but the greater part of his time and attention has been devoted to agricultural pursuits, in which he has met with good success. Though he has not amassed wealth, he has won a comfortable competence and a pleasant home, and is now numbered among the substantial and representative citizens of the community.

Regarding the article in "The History of Lehigh Co., PA Vol. 3" by Roberts, the article makes a mistake by naming Abraham's father as Alexander\*. **Abraham Mack** was a son of **Jacob Mack Jr.** and wife by the name of **Catharina**. This Abraham was b. 14 Aug 1798 and bapt. 23 Sep 1798 at Christ Evangelical Lutheran Church, Schoenersville, Lehigh Co PA (very near Allentown). His siblings that were baptized in the same church are **Elisabeth** b. 18 Sep 1795, **Maria** b. 12 Dec 1796, **Henry** b. 23 Dec 1800, **Maria Margaretha** b. 13 Aug 1802 and **Friedrich** b. 5 Oct 1804. I have reviewed the church records myself and am certain this Abraham is listed as a son of Jacob. It is believed that his ancestry is probably like this:

William Henry Mock seems to have disappeared from the time the Mocks moved from Tennessee until they arrived in Kansas. Mary Ann (Bracey) Mock arrived in Hays KS with her two youngest sons, James Robert and Phillip. She is buried in the Norman Cemetery near Hays, KS. To my knowledge, none of us who have worked this line for 25/35 years have ever found out what happened to William Henry Mock. Knisely b. 18 Aug 1822 married Susanna Feathers, d/o [Mathias] and Salome (Garn) Feathers; Susanna Feathers d. 20 Aug 1901. Salome Garn Feathers was a daughter of Frederick and Fanny Mock Garn. Fanny Mock was b. ca1774 in Bedford Co. a daughter of Peter and Elizabeth Mock. Fanny died in 1815.

## Descendant of Martha Ellen Mauk

My name is Nancy Willis. My husband, Max is the great grandson of Martha Ellen Mauk b.12 Oct.1837 Page Co., Va.; d.8 May 1902 Allen Co.KS. and John William Willis b.23 Nov 1832 Ky; d.28 May 1909 Allen Co, Kansas They were married 15 Feb 1855 in Hancock Co. IL.

When examining chart (23A) I learned that the place for John William's birth is given as Ross Co., Ohio.

Last summer a Robert Thompson was through Iola, Ks., where we live, on a genealogy trip researching Willis families. We agreed to exchange information when he returned home. When we did this we learned that the John William Willis he was searching was the son of Levin Willis of Ross County Ohio. The John William Willis who married Martha Ellen Mauk in Hancock County, Ill. in 1855 is not this John William Willis s/o Levin. Upon further checking Mr. Thompson learned that Levin's son John William lived, died and is buried in Ross Co., Ohio. Oddly enough Robert Thompson did have Willis families in and around Iola. We don't yet know if there is a connecting link or just coincidence.

John William Willis died before death certificates were issued in Kansas. I've returned to researching family after 25 years lay off. I did make notes years ago regarding John William Willis when talking with family members now deceased. They all said he was born in Kentucky, his death notice in the paper states this as well. Unfortunately his father died young and his mother re-married name unknown to anyone. So I still don't know John William's father's name nor the county in Kentucky. I think I've recently discovered his mother's name (this is a work in process and haven't the proof yet.)

The only other clue a family member gave was that Maysville, Kentucky was named after John William Willis's mother. As I couldn't go backwards due to lack of information I tried to learn about Maysville. So far no luck. This may just be a family tradition.

I've known almost nothing about the Mauks. Other Mauks were in our area as well and I'm still tracking them down.

One of John Willis's daughters married John A. Jenkins, a first cousin. I see at least 3 Mauk's marrying Jenkins in Hancock Co. Ill., that is another puzzle to unravel.

One other item: I've had a certified copy of John William and Martha Ellen's marriage certificate. It gives Martha ANN Mauk. I feel this is just one of those errors that happen sometimes. All other information including her death notice, gives her middle name as Ellen.

In the early seventies I took a genealogy class at our community college and was taught to make notes. Thank goodness. This mix up got me really sorting and sifting old information and I discovered a note I made when phoning an older relative about the Willis/Mauk family. I'd

noted 1/2 sister, married Wanness(sounds like), 1/2 brother in Mo. first name Boyd, Full sister named Priscilla Sanford.

Thanks to the Illinois Marriages online and an easily searched site at McDonough Co Ill GenWeb I believe I've located our John William Willis's mother in McDonough County Illinois which borders Hancock. This is still a work in process and must be proven.

Illinois Marriages show a Priscilla Willis marrying a Joseph Sanford, leading me to McDonough County. There were in McDonough Co. Census for 1840 two Willis heads of Household. One William the other Nancy. Back to Illinois Marriages-sure enough in 1841 a Mrs. Nancy Willis marries a Robert Boyd, apparently a widow again by 1850. The 1850 census lists everyone as Boyd—one feels the Census taker may have been tipping at the end of the day and there will be no way to prove this is John W. Willis not Boyd but coupled with a 1/2 brother first name Boyd I feel this is our Willis.

Again back to Illinois Marriages—in 1854 Mrs. Nancy Boyd marries a John Gibson. 1860 Census Mc Donough Co., give this household listing also an Allen Boyd and Aquilla Boyd and I've had the 1870 Hancock Co. census for years, but never would have put it all together were it not for the ease of searching from my computer the Illinois Marriages. The 1870 Census for John William Willis and Martha Ellen Mauk gives Allen Boyd living with them. Have lost him after that but will continue looking for him.

This seems to me to be too many Boyd/Willis not to be connected to the 1/2 brother, first name Boyd as my note said, but now believe it is LAST NAME BOYD.

## Mauks of Elliott Co., KY

My grandfather, D. Santford Mauk, was b. 1 Oct 1878 in Open Fork, Elliott Co, KY, a son of Peter Commodore and Linny C. [Whitt] Mauk. I have this documented in my grandfather's handwriting on the back of a small photo of the home where he was born. He died in El Monte, CA 1975. D. Santford married Katherine Josephine Pikel b. 1889 Wisconsin and d. 1960 El Monte, CA.

I am looking for information on my great grandfather, Peter Commodore, the son of Joseph Sr., Peter Commodores brothers and their families. I recall from info told to me from my grandfather D. Santford, that his mother Linny Whitt Mauk died young. My grandfather was approx 10 years of age (late 1880's) or so, ...the story goes like this...he stayed with his father after she died and traveled around the countryside as a stone mason, learning the trade. D. Santford had brothers, Commodore, Wilmore and Frank. Frank went to live with other relatives "that were more affluent, owned a store." The obituaries state that Minnie Mauk Bear was born in Carter Co., [KY] 19 May 1876, a dau. of Benjamin and Emma Black Rice. Her first husband was the late C.D. Mauk. My mother believes that Belle, the sister D. Santford spoke of was Minnie (Belle) Mauk Bear. C.D. [Commodore Dewey] and Minnie Mauk Bear had 2 sons, Watt P. Mauk of Houston, TX and R. Dewey Mauk of New Baltimore, OH - So perhaps D. Santford's sister was really a sister-in-law!?

I am trying to learn of the now day families and relatives of Peter Commodore's brothers, Samuel b. 1842, William b. 1846, Mary Frances b. 1848, Sarah Catherine b. 1852, Joseph dink Jr. b. 1854, Mary Jane b. 1854, John b. 1857, Amanda b. 1859, Jefferson David b. 1866, Laura Bell b. 1867, Sampson S. b. 1869.
