Jacob Hissong & Anna Mock of Bedford County, PA

In 1816, an Adam Hissong began paying tax in Woodberry Township, Bedford Co., Pennsylvania. Another Adam Hysong (Hisson, Hisong, Hishong) had paid taxes in Hopewell Township for each of the tax years from 1804 through 1811 but this was another man. The census for 1810 ¹ lists Adam Hishong in Hopewell Twp. with he and wife both over 45 years old. But the Adam who began paying taxes in 1816 was a younger man (2). In this report, he will be referenced as Adam(1796)

Adam(1796) paid a small amount of tax in Woodberry Twp., apparently as a married man, each tax year from 1816 through 1823. He was never shown as a "Single Freeman" which would indicate he was married before the 1816 tax year; the year he reached age 21. In the 1820 census, he appears with a wife aged between 16 to 26 and a daughter less than 10 years. His age shows as 26 to 45. He was listed as a farmer.

It is known from deed records later executed in Ohio that Adam(1796)'s wife was named Anna. Mock Family records establish this also and the Mock record states Adam(1796) and Anna Mock married in PA (3). Absent documentation of a marriage in Ohio, it is assumed Adam(1796) married Anna Mock in Bedford Co, PA in about 1816.

Jacob Mock(Mack), Anna Mock Hissong's father, moved his family from Bedford Co., PA to Knox Co., OH in about 1821. This could have prompted Adam(1796) and Anna to follow to nearby Richland Co. It appears Adam(1796) and family left Bedford Co, PA in late 1823 or early 1824 after being taxed there in 1823. On May 12, 1824, he purchased from the U. S. government the Northwest Quarter of Section 31 in Worthington Twp. of Richland Co., Ohio. At the time of the purchase, Adam(1796) was residing in Richland Co. The patent for his 152 acres was issued to him on September 20, 1824 and he was the first to own land in that section of the township⁴. It would be almost 25 years before the village of Independence (now Butler)was founded.

Adam(1796) is shown in the 1830 census⁵ with a son, probably *Jacob*, who was born circa 1824⁶, a daughter, probably **Betsey (Elizabeth)**, born 1822⁷ age 5-10, and another daughter age 10-15 who is likely the daughter, name unknown, born before 1820 and shown in the 1820 census as under 10 years of age. The other female in the 1830 census is age 15-20 which is not the correct age to be Adam(1796)'s wife Anna. Nor could Adam(1796) have a daughter that age. It is believed therefore that the age of his wife (Anna Mock) was incorrectly noted.

On September 13, 1837, Adam(1796) and his wife Anna sold 72 of their 152 acres to John Hissong⁸. Anna's name was shown in the deed as "Anny".

A daughter, Lovina, was born to Adam(1796) and Anna on January 29, 18399. The 1840 census shows them with the infant daughter, together with Betsey, age about 18, and Jacob about 16 and another male, age 20-30. The older male could have been a "hired man" who lived with them; a practice common in those days. Living adjacent to Adam(1796) and Anna was John S. Hissong and his family; the same John(1794/95) to whom they had sold the 72 acres in 1837.

On September 12th, 1839 a Margaret Hissong married a William Smith¹⁰. It appears from the 1840 census they lived on the other side of Adam(1796) and Anna away from John S. Hissong's family. This Margaret is believed likely to be the unidentified daughter of Adam(1796) and Anna who was shown in the 1820 Bedford Co. and 1830 Richland Co. census (See Above). In the 1840 Richland Co., OH census, William and Margaret Smith were both shown as age 20-30; no children.

On January 6, 1840, Adam(1796) purchased 117 acres in the SE corner of Section 32 in Worthington Twp. ¹¹. The land had been patented in 1825 to Samuel Dunken of Somerset Co., PA. Adam(1796) and Anna sold that same land to Jacob Garber on August 1st of the same year¹²

David Zook (who was born in Germany and had married into the Mock family) came from Bedford Co. to Richland Co., OH in about 1840. He left there and moved to Elkhart Co., IN in 1842. Jacob Mock, Anna (Mock) Hissong's father, followed with his family and purchased 80 acres in Elkhart Co., IN on March 11, 1845. Adam(17-96)and Anna also moved to Concord Twp, Elkhart Co. about that same time¹³ and they probably made the trek together.

Concord Twp., Elkhart Co., IN records show Elizabeth (Betsey) married James Middleton on September 14th, 1845. James was born in Delaware and was brought to Ohio when one year old in 1805.

The 1850 Census for Concord Twp, Elkhart Co, IN shows Adam, Anna, Jacob, and Levina living in the same house with Adam, Anna's daughter Betsey¹⁴ and her husband James Middleton. Also listed in this household is John Middleton, age 2, born Indiana, son of James and Betsey. There were three additional children; Jacob Smith, age 8, born in Ohio, Betsey Smith, age 6 and Nancy Smith, age 4, both girls born in Indiana¹⁵. It is likely these Smith children belonged to William and Margaret and are in the

She mentioned that her husband's Wetzstein family is connected with the Maags through Isaac Wetzstein who married Anna Maria Maag, d/o Jacob and Barbara Maag of PHL. I don't have a Jacob and Barbara in the chart #1. She mentions names that are in the chart, so think I may be missing a Jacob. She also mentions a will for Jacob Maag Sr. divided between Jacob, s/o Isaac Wetstein and two children of Conrad Maag.

Hopefully you can work your miracles and come up with all these answers!!

The problem with this Maag family in Philadelphia is that too many people have jumped to too many conclusions -and I believe inaccurate information has been published in prior issues of MFH. For instance, I think Bill Young was in error in the chart he submitted to the MFH Spring 2002 issue, page 18. I think a more correct chart should show that Jacob Maag and Anna Surber were parents of Henry b. 1723, and Conrad born 1730.

The following info. from Mike Moak I believe is correct. I am very familiar with Mike's work, and he is usually very accurate.

From Mike Moak to Steve Lapp

Re: Philadelphia Maags

I have been able to (circumstantially) find one family from Bülach parish that ended up in Pennsylvania.

According to Faust, in 1743 Jacob Maag, a resin scraper, left Eschenmosen with his wife, three sons, and two daughters. There was only one Maag family in Eschenmosen at that time: Jacob Maag and Anna Surber, and children Hans Heinrich (1722), Heinrich (1723), Dorothea (1725), Anna Maria (1729), Hans Conrad (1730), Barbara (1732), Hans Marthi (1734), Hans Jacob (1735), and Anna (1737).

Barbara Dittig of the Mock Family Historian shows a family, that includes Heinrich, Conrad, and Barbara that lived and married in Philadelphia from the 1750s on, that she proposes are related to the Jacob, Heinrich, and Hans Heinrich Maag that arrived in Philadelphia in 1743 on the Loyal Judith. [This makes (circumstantial) sense - Jacob, the father, and two sons, Hans Heinrich (age 21) and Heinrich (age 20) were the males in the group over age 16. The next son, Hans Conrad, was only 13.]

Here's the info that I have:

Jacob Maag of Endhöri, Zürich, Switzerland, m. 25 Mar 1721 **Anna Surber** of Endhöri. They had the following children:

- . 1 Hans Heinrich Maag b. 26 Jul 1722 in Endhöri.
- . 2 Heinrich Maag b. 14 Nov 1723 in Endhöri.
- . 3 Dorothea Maag b. 2 Mar 1725 in Endhöri.

- . 4 Anna Maria Maag b. 16 Jan 1729 in Endhöri.
- . 5 Hans Conrad Maag b. 1 Oct 1730 in Endhöri.
- . 6 Hans Marthi Maag b. 16 Dec 1731 in Endhöri, d. 23 Dec 1732 in Endhöri.
- . 7 Barbara Maag b. 23 Dec 1732 in Endhöri.
- . 8 Hans Marthi Maag b. 28 Mar 1734 in Endhöri, d. 26 May 1734 in Endhöri.
- . 9 Hans Jacob Maag b. 25 Aug 1735 in Endhöri, d. 12 Oct 1735 in Eschenmosen.
- .10 Anna Maag b. 1 Jan 1737 in Eschenmosen, d. 23 Jan 1739 in Eschenmosen.

This record shows one more daughter than Faust lists. There is one unreadable spot in the microfilm of the death register at the start of 1743 that has about 4 entries. Or perhaps Dorothea stayed in Switzerland and married (she was 18-1/2 in Oct 1743) although there is no entry for the marriage of a Dorothea Maag between 1740 and 1746.]

I have not been able to follow this family back. Anna is the only child born in Eschenmosen, all the others were born in Endhöri (nearby in the same parish - Bülach). Jacob and Anna were married in 1721 and there are no certain connections for Jacob in Endhöri before that.

The Philadelphia Reformed Church record entry, that states that Jacob died 18 May 1767 at age 61 years and 3 months, places his birth in Feb1706.

There are two Jacob Maags (first cousins) born in Endhöri between 1700 and 1710:

Jacob Maag, son of Heinrich Maag and Kleinvre Volkhart, b. 27 May 1703

Jacob Maag, son of Felix Maag and Susan Zymiker, b. 25 Dec 1704]

Now, regarding Lois Flyte and her research, if everything she has documented is correct, I believe that the above Anna Surber Maag died around 1766 or 1767, and Jacob Maag remarried. There is a marriage record from First Reformed Church in Philadelphia: Jacob Maag married Barbara Stonemetz on 23 Sept 1768. (See MFH Vol.IX, pages 6 and 7).

From 1772 to 1775 Jacob and Barbara Maag sponsor 3 children in baptism at the same church, including the Whetstone children.

1777 Apr 12 Jacob Maag will written, naming wife Barbara, son Conrad's 2 children and Isaac Whetstone's son Jacob.

1777 May 6 Jacob Maag is buried at Philadelphia First Reformed Church, age 77 years and 3 months.

ASSUMPTION: @1770 Anna Maria Maag married Isaac Wetzstein ("Whetstone")

At Christ Church in Philadelphia, Anna Maag married Jacob Feit 12 Jun 1770. It is a stretch, but this could be a miswriting or misreading of a WEITstein marriage.

At any rate, this scenario is the best way I can see to account for all the varied data. Hope this helps you. Steve Lapp in Texas

Mock Family of Union and Robeson Townships, Berks Co., PA Submitted by Dennis Walsh

My wife Annette is a Mock descendant. I've been searching a few years for the ancestors of her g-g-grandfather, John Mock, who was born in PA about 1856, and died 1938 in Tama County, IA. Through death records I've connected John to a brother named William H. Mock, who also lived in the area and is buried near John. Recently I located the family of Oliver and Sarah Mock, originally of Berks Co., PA, who are (through endless census searches) the best candidates to be John and William's parents.

Through recent research I have made a positive connection for Oliver's parents to be Adam Mock and Rebecca Wynn, of Berks Co. Adam's parents were Jacob (born in the 1750s) and Elizabeth [unknown] Mack/Mock, again of Berks Co. This information comes from probate, Orphan's court, and other administrative records I recently obtained.

Jacob died in 1810, his wife Elizabeth died in 1828, his son, Adam died young in 1835, and Adam's wife Rebecca died in 1856 - all in Union twp., Berks Co, PA. Jacob and Elizabeth's children were born in the Berks/ Chester Co. vicinity in the latter 1700s to the turn of the 19th century. Their names include John, Jacob Jr., Rebecca (married Samuel Richards), Catharine (married John Griffith), Sarah, and the two youngest sons, Matthias and Adam (born perhaps about 1802). Many of these families can be traced living near one another in the southern Berks/northern Chester Co. area from 1790 to 1860, and in the case of some of Oliver's family into the 1900s.

Needless to say I need to locate fellow researchers and learn much more. I am submitting the following chart for Jacob and Elizabeth Mock of Union Twp, Berks Co., PA. Members of this family were located in Union Twp for over 100 years beginning with Jacob Mock who left a will in 1810, he being born sometime in the 1750s according to the early census. I've traced multiple generations beginning with children who are named in various court records.

This is my line and I have accumulated over 200 individuals descended from Jacob and Elizabeth. There is not much research that has been completed on these families, and I would like to raise awareness of their existence.

Markle Whitaker & Catherine Mock of Bedford Co PA

Catherine Mock b. 12 Mar 1808; d. 27 May 1888 Pleasantville, PA; m. Michael Wittaker. The 8 children named in Catherine Mock Whitaker's Will were: Maria Wittaker, Juliann Wittaker, Jonathon Wittaker, Joseph Wittaker, Henry Wittaker, Samuel Wittaker, Amos Wittaker, Peter Wittaker

I am from the distaff side of the family, so to speak, but I wanted to ask if you had any information about or people interested in Catherine Mauk/Mock of Bedford County, PA (1808-1888). Her parents were Peter Jr. and Catherine (Garn) Mock of Reynoldsdale.

Catherine and my great-great-grandfather, Markle Whitaker (1811-1888), were married in about 1830 and divorced? by 1845 or so, when he went to Steubenville, OH, became "Old Mark Whitaker" and lived with his brother Hiram Whitaker for a time before remarrying in 1848. They both were sons of Joseph and Catherine (Markle) Whitaker of Chester Co. and trained in blacksmithing. Mark rarely gave information about his parentage, so he might have been hiding in plain sight. It is difficult to know just what was going on!

Anyway, Catherine Mauk/Mock Whitaker almost always was referred to as a widow, but the truth was he abandoned her and their nine young children. The family story from my male Whitakers was that Catherine was a "shrew" and he had left her; the female story was that she had died and he left the children with relatives and headed West....

She and the children stayed in Bedford Co. and she must have been destitute, as we know from the fine research of a direct Whitaker-Mauk/Mock descendant, Phyllis Winthurst.

It is interesting that they both died in 1888. I do not know if Markle kept in touch or ever tried to help; it is thought that some of the children visited him from time to time or moved to Ohio in adulthood. I do not have a lot on his first family; only the second family of 13 children, one of whom was my great-grandfather. Mark was married for 40 years to his second wife, Elizabeth Turnbull (1830-1912) — yes, those dates are correct, she was very young when they met! And he was a pillar of the community... Mark must have divorced Catherine in PA before he left or soon after he got to Ohio. I don't think he would have gotten away with deceit/bigamy for that long, since the court noted that he was "free of encumbrances to marry." We have not found the records for the divorce, however.

I just wanted to thank you for this fine Web site and share some interesting Mock genealogy with you. I do not have much on Catherine, and what I have has just been discovered by me on-line.

Joseph B. Mock of Bedford Co., PA & Marshall Co. IL

In my internet wanderings looking for Pennsylvania-Illinois connections, I found that a grandson of Peter Mock (1742-1817) of Bedford County, PA ended up in Marshall County, IL. This would be Joseph B, son of Jacob. Joseph B. is on chart #16 individual 1.3A. While I don't see in the archives that anyone is researching these Marshall County IL Mocks, I thought knowing this connection might be useful to someone in the future.

Joseph B Mock married Catherine Taylor on July 1st, 1847 in Bedford County according to the 16 July 1847 Bedford Gazette. They appear with 2 children in the 1850 Bedford County census but not in later censuses in Bedford County.

Obituary for Catherine Mock

August 7, 1879

In Whitefield, July 31 of cancer, Catherine, aged 52 years, wife of Joseph M. Mock.

Death of Mrs. Mock

Mrs. Catherine Mock, wife of Joseph B. Mock, died at her residence at Whitefield Corners, Thursday afternoon of last week. She had been feeble upwards of two years, and her death was not unexpected. The cause was cancer of the breast. Mrs. Mock, whose maiden name was Taylor, was a native of York county, Pa., born November 24, 1827. She was married July 1, 1847 to J. B. Mock, and for 21 years was a resident of Whitefield township. Three daughters and two sons were the fruits of this union, all nearly grown, being reared by a father's and mother's care, the youngest being 18 years of age. For many years Mrs. Mock had been a beloved and earnest member of the M. E. church, and in her long, painful illness, she bore her suffering with firm confidence and abiding hope in the religion of Jesus Christ. Mr. Ezra Calef had general charge of the funeral, while the pall bearers, all old neighbors, consisted of Ira Torry, William Fountain, Elias Herr, Moses Hartley, E. G. Green and Thomas Funson. The interment took palce at the Center church graveyard, two miles distant, and the procession was a very long one.

The recent talk of the Civil War information available at the PA Digital Archives, reminded me of a family of three Mock brothers I found at the site whose cards luckily gave detailed physical characteristics which isn't true of all the cards at this site.

Although their hair color, eye color and complexion were a variety of things all three seemed quite tall for this period with two brothers 6'1" and the third 6'3". Previously I had come across a tax record which noted Jacob Mock (big). One possibility is that he is an uncle of these three brothers which seems to make intuitive sense. Height being something like a much less sensitive test than DNA but certainly genetically determined. Of course, there can be great differences in height in families as well since multiple factors are involved. But anecdoctally it seemed that height was overall the characteristic most linked in a variety of brother combinations I found at that site and at the Ellis Island site for other non-Mock lines

Died

At Dry Creek, March 1, 1891, N. P. Mock, a native of North Carolina, aged 58 years.

Obituary

Alexander Mock died at Placerville, June 1. He was born at Midway, Davidson county, North Carolina, April 27. 1831. In June 1852. He came to the gold fields of California. He began mining In Placerville but in about three years removed to Dry Creek, where he has since resided with his sister-in-law, Mrs. N. P. Mock. He had been suffering from paralysis for some time past, from which he died last Wednesday, at Placerville.

The remains were taken to Georgetown, and after services in the M. E. Church by Rev.Thos. Murriah, were laid to rest by the side of his brother, N. P. Mock, who preceded him to the other shore by a few years. The floral pieces were many and beautiful. The community in general share the loss with the family as Mr. Mock was well known and highly respected by all.

June 8, 1898.

Peter Mauck of Tom's Brook, VA Kathryn Purtich

In Wolph's book on Peter Mauck b. 1708, it was stated that Eve was the wife of Henry Mauck, b. 1754.

Has anyone found Eve's maiden name? On the internet Mock "archives", RonMoore and others discussed that Eve's maiden name may have been Doscher or variant. Where did they marry? Was John Mauck of Hawkins Co, TN the son of Henry and Eve Mauck????

It is not known when Henry came to TN. Apparently he was in Augusta Co, VA militia in 1774 and went to the head of the Potomac to quell Indian uprisings.

In 1977 my VA "Mock Cousin" received a letter from Mrs. (David?) Hunt, Speedway, Indiana inquiring about Henry and Eve Mauck. As I recall, she had a Bible with their name. After my Cousin answered the letter, she never heard from her again. The following is info she disclosed: Henry and Eve _____ Mauck

Their daughter, Sarah Mauck b. 1795; m. 1 Feb1818 George Hunt b. 2 Jul 1793 s/o George R. & Barbara Hunt, a land surveyor in Sullivan Co, TN area. The wedding took place at Henry's home in Goodson District. (Goodson District was the upper part of Bristol. TN but on the Washington Co. line of VA.

In Wolph's book – Peter 1708 will: Fredrick got 100 acres, sold 1779, went to Wilkes Co, NC; Andrew was to have the plantation where his father lived. When Andrew came of age, he was to pay Henry 30 pounds currency from the plantation.

Nov. 1788, Henry, spelled Hawke, and Eve his wife (sold?) to Alexander Berry, 200 acres for 100 pounds in current money of NC, north side of the Holston in the Island Flatts, adj. Pendleton Patent Line, David Woodley's land near the wagon road and near a dry branch. The deed was signed by Henry in German. Witness: John Cottrell, David Booth, Johnathan (x) Starkey, Abstracts, Sullivan Co, TN Deed Book 1.

Dec. 1791 John Hunt, Jr. (bought?) 100 acres joining William Mitchell.

Date? William Burke (sold?) to Henry Mauck, 47 acres below Funks Ferry, south side of the Holston, first surveyed by John Hunt, Sr. by deed conveyed to me (Wm. Burke?) by son John Hunt, Jr.

May 1794 Deed Book 2, Henry Mock to Michael (?Gimchleigh?) Sullivan Co, TN

100 acres South Side of Eaton Ridge/ Chestnutt Ridge. Adj: John Dean

Sept. 1794 Henry Mock (bought?) 450 acres, Rich Bottom Branch, north side of the Holston, Sullivan Co,

I found my great-grandmother's grave at a little church in Rabbit Hash, KY. Her name was Madeline Mock b. ca1842 d/o Steven & Sarah Cayton Mock; d. 10 Sept 1884; m. 30 Dec 1859 J.T. Duncan (John Thomas, I think). I found their marriage Certificate #251 at the Boone Co. courthouse. The witness was Mr. Ben Riggs. Certificate #253,also dated 12/30/1859, Joseph Riggs married Margaret E. Mock. Witnessed by J.T. Duncan. The weddings were performed at the home of Steven Mock. #252 was missing.

Rabbit Hash Ky. is directly across the Ohio River from Rising Sun, Id. The graveyard is just west of town. I'm not sure but I believe it's an old Episcopal Church. Many of the gravestones of the S. Mocks are still intact.

I thought the article on Ron Moore was a wonderful tribute to him and I'm only sorry I didn't get a chance to get to know him. I suspect we were related through our Mock and Reeds.

I found something very interesting and want to run it by you.

I've been trying to figure our my David Manuel Reed/Barnet Reid, b. 1833, probably in Rowan or Burke Co. NC, but found in 1860 Garrard Co. KY census and 1870 Boone Co KY census living next door first in Garrard to Jos. Houck and then in Boone, Stephen Mawk/Mock.

I just found where a Reid researcher who has many of the same Reids I'm looking at has a Frederick Mock in Lincoln Co. NC who married a Sarah Mouser. Now, I have that same man and woman, but have them as Frederick Houk and Sarah Mouser. Do you think the Mocks and Houck are the same family? One family changing their name just by one initial and turning up in KY? In all my

research, this particular family of Houk seems to be in all the places my David/Barnet is in and my David Barnet changed his name. Thanks for any thoughts on this!

After his wife died, he remarried and his wife became their 5th mother and he was their 4th father. His wife had 6 girls and one of the girls married one of the adopted boys who was no relation.

First Hessian Settlers in Upper Canada Submitted by Kathy Busby

I sent an e-mail to United-Empire-Loyalist-L@rootsweb.com regarding Hessian settlers in Canada and received the following forwarded message from John Merz

Hello Upper Canada!

I want to remind all Upper Canada Hessian descendants that on 21 August 2004, a Saturday, we will be having a Hessian Day at The Rose House Museum near Picton, to commemorate the first Hessian soldier settlement in Ontario. A group of appr. 30 Hessians came in the summer of 1784 under the leadership of the Baron von Reitzenstein to settle in the Fifth Township of Marysburg.

Here are the names as taken from the 'Return of disbanded Men from the German Troops, Oct.4, 1784 (National Archives - Haldimand Papers):

I wrote to John Merz, the following Subject: Gottlieb Mauck, with first Hessian settlers in Upper Canada

I am researching my family and believe that I am descended from a Hessian soldier. His name was Gottlieb or Gaspard Mouck. He was born around 1755 and died about 1795. He came to Canada in Oct. 1784 with a wife and three sons under the age of ten. His wife passed away (date unknown), and he married a woman named Marie Louise Tesson D'Honore in Montreal in Jan. 1785. He settled in South Bay, South Marysburgh Township, Prince Edward County, Ontario.

Hello Kathy,

Here is a part of what I find in my files: There are several spellings of Mauck, Mock, Mouck,

Mauk, Mack. Grant to William Mouch, M'bgh, 100 acres, 2.Nov.1803;

Grant to William Mouch, M'bgh, 100 acres, 2.Nov.1803; Grant to Michael Mouch, M'bgh, 100 acres, 29.Oct. 1802; Grant to Louis Mouch, M'bgh, 100 acres, 16. Jan. 1804.

(These must be the sons of Gottlieb Mauck, as he is listed in S#150: Muster Roll of 5th Town, Oct.4, 1784 as member of Baron von Reitzenstein's Group of discharged German soldiers:

Gottlieb Mauck 1 man, 1 woman, 3 male children under 10, on certificate 11. Aug. 1784 for 3 1/2 rations per day (PAC MG 25 G vol.382)

There were two Hessen-Hanau soldiers with the names of Mauck, Caspar, Hanau Chasseur, Francken Comp., born in Grossen-Linden/Hessen, discharged in Canada July 1783, Mauck, Gottlieb, Hanau Chasseur, Wittgenstein's Comp, born in Unterellen, west of Eisenach/Thuringia, discharged in Canada July 1783.

There is also a Philipp Mauk in the files, but I have no other info. as that he married Helen Walder (probably Waldorf) on 13. Oct.1782 at the Christ Church Cathedral in Montreal (\$\frac{4}{327}\$). No witnesses named.

We have tried to find Kaspar Mauck/Mack in the church books of Grossen-Linden, we found a Mack family starting with a Georg Mack born in 1540, but could not find any entries for Kaspar, born appr, 1759/60. Research continuesCheers, John Merz
