# JACOB MOCK - A DESCENDANT OF ALEXANDER MACK

In the Fall 1994 issue of the MFH, p. 44, I wrote that in searching for my Mocks in Elkhark Co. IN, I ran across a land record for a Jacob Mock. At the time I thought this Jacob could possibly be a brother to my Michael, b. York Co. PA 1772. (Jacob and Michael, sons of George (Soldier George) and Eve Mock of York and Bedford Co., PA. Now on further research I have figured out who this Jacob Mock is.

I first ordered a film (from FHC) My Kinkle-Mack/Mock Ancestry by Manley W. Mallet, pub.1981. Then with some working charts that Steve Lapp had posted on the Alexander Mock family, I was able to see this Jacob Mack/Mock was a son of Alexander Mock of Bedford Co., PA, Will dated 8 Nov 1811. Alexander being the son of John Mack and Margarette Sneider. John being the son of Alexander Mack "The Dunker"

This Jacob Mock has not previously been well documented. Only 2 of his children had been known. I have put together the following on this family:

Jacob Mock was born ca1770's in Washington Twp., Franklin Co., PA. He died Oct 1847 in Elkhart Co., IN. His wife was Margarethe Jacob.

Jacob moved with his parents to Woodbury Twp., Bedford Co.,PA ca1804. He is mentioned in his father's will probated 2 Dec 1811. In 1821 - Jacob moved to Knox Co., OH.

11 Mar 1845 he purchased 80 acres of land in Elkhart Co., IN.

On 18 Oct 1847 in Elkhart Probate Court in the matter of Estate of Jacob Mock, David Zook, A.C. Manning and Horatio Pierson file an application for letter of administration of estate. On 10 Apr 1848, John Mock, Alexander Mock, Elizabeth Wineland, Margaret Long and Susanna Kunkle all of Knox Co., OH appoint David Zook of Elkhart Co., IN to be their administrator in the matter of Estate of Jacob Mock.

Final distribution of surplus to heirs occured in Nov 1853 Court Term in Elkhart Co. Heirs listed: John Mock, Alexander Mock, Elizabeth Wineland, David Long in right of his wife, Amos Fike in right of his wife, Martin Kunkle in right of his wife, Adam Hissong in right of his wife, Henry Hetrick in right of his wife.

From the Pictorial and Biographical Memoirs of Elkhart and St. Joseph Counties Indiana, pub. 1893, I found the following biographical sketch on Daniel Zook.

"Mr. Zook was born in Elkhart Co.,IN 22 Jan 1851, the youngest son of John and Rebecca (Shellenberger) Zook. John was born in Huntington Co., PA 4 Mar 1818, a son of David and Mary (Mack) Zook, David being a native of Germany and his wife a daughter of Alexander Mack, who helped to found the German Baptist Church in this country. ...David Zook and family made their home in Pennsylvania until 1840, then came as far west as Richland Co., OH, and there, for a few years, followed the life of a pioneer tiller of the soil. Elkhart Co.,IN became their home in 1842 and here they resided on a woodland farm until the discover of gold in California in 1849. when he made the overland trip to the gold fields, where he remained until his death, two years later.

That John was a son of David and Mary Mack Zook (dau. of Alexander) is an obvious error - to my knowledge Alexander Mack did not have a daughter, Mary. Nancy Mack, dau. of William and Agnes (Gantz) Mack, married David Zook 13 Apr 1817. They are the probable parents of John Zook, b. 4 Mar 1818.

# JACOB MOCK OF NORTHAMPTON CO., PA

Northamption Co.,PA was formed from Bucks Co.,PA in 1752. The earliest known Mack in the area is John Mack who is shown in 1728 on a petition in Goshenhoppoen, (See MFH Vol. II, No. 1). In 1749 there is a deed for George Mack, unfortunately it is totally illegible and I have not been able to tie him in to the other Mack's in the area.

In land records dated 1773, Jacob Mack purchased land in Richland Twp. and sold it in 1777 and 1783. In 1812 this Jacob Mack has a will filed in Hanover Twp., Northampton Co, PA. In this will he lists his wife Catharina and all of his children. The executor for his will is his son George. (My 4 g grandfather). The land that Jacob owned in Northampton Co., Pa was bordered by the Hartzel and Broeder families. Both of these families married into the Mack family.

In this same time period there is a William Mack that is listed as having land in Northampton Co., PA. I feel that there is a connection between these two Mack families as the Hartzells and Broeders are listed in various documents with both Mack families.

According to records in Bucks Co., PA, it would seem that Jacob is the son of Wilhelm (William) Mack and his 2nd wife Maria Lisa.

George Mack, b. 1778 PA, married Elizabeth (Coon?) and had a family of 6 known children. 4 of these children have baptismal records in the Christ Reformed Lutheran Church in Schoenersville, LeHigh, PA. It is shortly after the death of Jacob that George and his family sell land in Northampton Co., PA and start their way to Fairfield Co., OH. According to census records, the youngest 2 children are listed as being born in PA, but no record has been found of either of their births. George and his family appear on the 1830 census of Fairfield Co., OH. The first land transactions that I have found for him in OH are in 1848 in Ross Co. OH [a land grant], where he purchased and sold land to and from his son, Daniel. George and his wife, Elizabeth are both buried in the Stukey Cemetery in Berne, Fairfield Co.

Jefferies as Sureties, Jesse Fairfield Co., OH 14 Apr 1854, Lunancy case of George Mock, having heard testimony of JA Ream, Thomas Jackson and MM Shoemaker, removal of Wm Mitchell guardian; mental dibility if existed is removed, guardianship to terminate. Fairfield Co., OH 11 May 1854 Lunancy case of Geo. Mock, Wm Mitchell guardian is ordered to pay said Mack the balance remaining in his hands.

#### From the Shepherdstown (VA) Register

Saturday, 20 Feb 1858 - Marriage Notices:

"On Thursday evening last, by the Rev. Norval Wilson, Mr. James W. Jones to Miss Lydia A. Mock, all of Charlestown".

Friday, 30 Jan 1885 - From the Charlestown Spirit:

"We are pleased to learn that Mr. Geo. W. Mock of this place has a good prospect of becoming the beneficiary of about eighty thousand dollars' worth of real estate in PA - from his deceased grandmother and through an aunt now living."

Friday, 5 Oct 1888

Married: At the Carter House in Charlestown on 24 Sep 1888, Mr. George W. Feltner of Warren Co., VA to Miss Sarah B. Mauck of this county.

Friday, 25 Oct 1889

In Shepherdstown at the M.E. Parsonage, by Rev. H.C. McDaniel, 8 Oct 1889, Mr. Charles Spong of Sharpsburg, MD and Miss Katie Muck of Shepherdstown.

Friday, 27 Nov 1891

"Mrs. Mary J. Mock, wife of Mr. George W. Mock, died at her home in Charlestown on Tuesday."

Thursday, 2 Dec 1897

"Miss Susannah Muck, an aged resident of this place, died last night at 9 o'clock at the home of Mr. Elmer Dusing. She had been sick for a long time and her death was a result of a complication of diseases. The deceased, who was a sister of Mr. Thomas Muck, was a native of Frederick Co., MD and was 75 years and 9 months of age. She was a member of the Reformed Church and was a good woman. Her funeral will be held Friday morning at the Reformed Church in this place.

Thursday, 15 Dec 1898

"Mrs. Sarah Ann Avis, widow of John S. Avis, died at her home in Charlestown last Sunday in her 80th years. She is survived by four daughters...Mrs. George A. Mock ...."

Thursday, 23 Nov 1899

"Mr. William B. Mock an old resident of Charlestown, died last Sunday night in the 71st year of his age. A son and a daughter survive him."

Thursday, 29 Mar 1900"Charles Muck, the five year old son of Mr. William Muck, died yesterday the the home of his parents in Shepherdstown."

Thursday, 24 Jan 1907

"Mr. William Thomas Muck, one of the old residents of Shepherdstown, died at his home in this place last Thursday, aged 75 years. He had been infirm in body and mind for a long time and his death was a happy release from earthly troubles. The deceased was a native of the vicinity of Middletown, MD. but moved here some fifty years ago where he has since lived most of the time. He is survived by two sons and three daughters. The funeral service was conducted at his late home on Saturday by rev. Dr. H.C. Haithcox and the body was interred in the Reformed Cemetery.

Thursday, 4 June 1914

"Mrs. John Mock, formerly of Luray VA died last Thursday at her home at Duffields, from consumption, aged 38 years. Survived by her husband and 3 small children. She was buried Friday at Duffields."

Thursday, 24 Jun 1915

"Charles Clayton Mock, who for the past twelve years has conducted the restaurant at the B&O station in Martinsburg, died last Saturday. He was a native of Loudoun Co., VA and was 54 years of age. He is survived by his wife, 3 sons and 2 daughters."

Once again I was trying to cut down on the memberships which come due at the beginning of the year and YOU screwed it up. (or at least the ancestors did!) I got the MFH this week and was certainly surprised about the Mock of Harrison Co., IN. I have recently been to Corydon which is the Co. Seat of Harrison Co. I am the genealogist in the Bartholomew Co. Clerk's office. Indiana's Co. Clerks hold the marriage licences, wills, probate records, civil records & other assorted records. One of the huge surprises that came about in recent years was the fact that the local road which I had always called "Mocksberry" Road is in fact Mauxferry Road. This is supposed to be the oldest road in Bartholomew Co. The road starts at Maucksport on the Ohio River and that is where the Mock's Ferry was and hence the name of the road and town. If anyone is interested in doing research the John Hay Museum in Salem is full of things about the area & the Public Library and the courthouse in Corydon have lots of info on Mock's as I kept stumbling across them when doing research on my Davis & Willson families.

The second part of this letter is about my Mauch's. I am enclosing a family tree of my Mauchs who I have recently traced back to Germany. (Dunningen, Wurtenberg, Germany). This info comes from the LDS libraRy of Catholic records of this town - written in Latin! Imagine my surprise when I found mention of the death of a sister of my g. grandmother's in Danville, IL. This family of Mauchs settled in Lafayette/Tippacanoe Co., IN in the 1860's. They were members of the German Catholic Church, St. Boniface, and are buried in St. Joseph's Old Catholic Cemetery. There was a huge

group of German Catholics who settled there in the 1850-60 era. My Grandfather married the daughter of a family who came over in the 1840's & settled in S.E. Indiana. Early Ancestor chart is as follows:

# Found Theobald & Phillip Mack Sons of John Mack of Berks Co.,PA Steve Lapp

While filing away loose notes and copies (I should finish by 2000!), and rereading the "M" section from the 1994 book *Pennsylvania Births - Philadelphia County*, by Humphrey, I discovered the following entries from "Records of St. Michael's Lutheran Church in Germantown":

 Mack Theobald b. 30 Oct 1749 to parents, Johannes and Maria Agnes.

Mak, Joh. Philipp b. 14 Jan 1753 to parents, Johans and Maria Agnesa.

In the MFH Vol. I, #5,pg 44-45, an article and Family Chart for Philip Mack states Philip's birth as 27 Oct 1752, PA (?).

It would appear that the first wife of John Mack (he died in Reading, Berks Co.,PA) is this Maria Agnes, mother of Theobald/Devalt and Phillip Mack/Mock. This still does not explain the older Devalt Mock in the North Carolina records, but it does further identify the Cont'd on next page

children in John Mack's Reading PA will. I'm quite pleased with this find and want to get a complete copy of the St. Michael's Lutheran Church at Germantown records (not to be confused with the same name church in Philadelphia) which begin in 1741.

IF the above John Mack is indeed the same as the John Mack who died 14 Sep 1784, Berks Co., PA, then he <u>cannot</u> be the John Mack listed as an immigrant on the ship *St. Andrew*, qualifying in Philadelphia on 23 Sep 1752, as so many researchers have claimed.

Dear Barbara, Enclosed please find check for \$10 to cover a years subscription to your Mauk Family N/L.... I am interested in the John Mauck of Frederick Co.,VA who married abt. 1760 to Anna Ottilia ZumWald, youngest dau. of Johann Wilhelm "Andreas" ZumWald and Anna Catharina "Margaretha" Jacobs. Ottilia was b. 29 Jan 1736 at Niederauerbach (Zweibrucken) Germany and seems to have died about 1801 in Shenandoah Co.,VA. Widower, John Mauck seems to have remarried in 1806 and later went to Indiana where he founded the Maukport ferry service.

I am currently assembling a plat map of the 1750's & 60's showing the Frederick Co., VA land owned by the Zumwalt's and Mauck's. It is very slow as I have to wait approx. two mo, for each plat and then try to identify its

position with each neighbor. I have a number of questions concerning the lineage of John Mauck and his siblings. I also find it necessary to research the allied families of Pitman, Keller, Crabill, Hottel, Black (Swartz), Yeager (Hunter), Ridenhour, Denton and Weaver. Anyone of your subscribers who would care to exchange on this problem would be appreciated. I also need a family group sheet on John Mauck's parents. I have made an extensive search for the elusive Balthazar, unfortunately I have not been able to find his birth/baptism, marriage or death date. At the same time I have collected many hundred of Mock references and have helped many people with their Mock lines. I have quite an extensive database on the surname which is growing rapidly. ...4/4/95 I am amazed and extremely pleased to see and hear of the MFH and the dedicated group of researchers. I would very much like to join your association...I have found that several members of my line have emigrated to New Zealand, Australia and Canada, but so far none to the U.S.A. 
