John Mock of Mock's Bottom

Portland, Multnomah Co., Oregon Submitted by Jax Zumwalt

As a Mock descendant, I wondered how an area in Portland, OR became known as "Mock's Bottom". As it turned out John Mock built a home on the bluff which is now on the historic homes register here in Portland. Part of the farm land behind the house is now a city park.

The land below the bluff on the Willamette River

is known as Mock's Bottom. It was the main ship channel to the Portland docks. The sailing ships had a hard time negotiating the tight curves under the bluff and the channel was eventually straightened, by passing Mock's Bottom. Mock's Bottom was eventually filled in and is now the home of a large industrial complex. As a high school student I parked on Mock's Bottom while working in the Henry J. Kaiser Shipyards in WWII. Later I worked for another employer for about 25 years on "Swan Island", adjoining Mock's Bottom.

Iohn Mock

John Mock was born in Mechanicsburg, PA 4 Oct 1838. His parents were Henry and Elizabeth Mock, natives of Germany, who came to America and settled in Mechanicsburg. In 1844 the family moved to Platte Co., MO and there the father purchased a 40 acres tract of land upon which he resided until 1852, when they left by wagon train to Oregon, arriving in Portland in October of that year. The following spring Henry took up a donation claim of three hundred and seventeen acres in the district now known as University Park. Neighbors assisted them in building their first log cabin which continued to be the family home until 1874.

John stayed on his father's farm, helping in the tasks of clearing, developing and making improvements. At the age of 18 he started out independently, devoting the next six years to mining and the operation of a pack train.

John's mother, Elizabeth died in 1876. His father returned to Germany and was robbed of all he had. John saved for two years to bring him back to Portland. John had purchased the property belonging to his father. Henry made his home with his son until his death at age

of ninety-one years.

On the 4th of August, 1874, John Mock was united in marriage to Miss Mary M. Sunderland, a daughter of Benjamin and Elizabeth Sunderland who came from Iowa. John and Mary had the following children: Elizabeth who married John B. Yeon of Portland; John Ben-

jamin who married Vietta Curtis; Lillie Catherine became the wife of Dr. William F.

Amos and Margaret Alice.

As the years passed Mr. Mock saw great changes in the district in which he resided. For a long period there was no road between St. Johns and Portland and the produce was carried to market by boat. Today it is almost impossible to tell where the one city ends and the other begins, such has been the extension of Portland's boundaries.

Mr. Mock always rejoiced in what was accomplished in the way of development and improvement. He lived to see the Willamette Boulevard built along the

Willamette River past the beautiful residence which he erected. He did much toward granting land for boulevard purposes and was a most generous contributor to various kinds of public development. Columbia University received its splendid campus as the result of his interest in education and he labored earnestly toward developing the street railway system in the peninsula.

I worked with the grandson of John and Mary Mock Yeon. He lived as a boy in the beautiful Mock Mansion overlooking Swan Island and Mock's Bottom.

Last issue, on the subscription renewal form, I asked for queries and suggestions for future issues. Here are some of the responses.

"Soldier" George descendant

Iso much enjoyed the publishing of additional findings of daughter of Johannes Valentin Mack, son of Alexander Mack, Sr. discovered by Ron Moore and published in Vol. VII, No. 4, Fall 1998, p. 49. This is PRECISELY why I subscribe to this newsletter! I am so excited to find additional relatives of Alex. Mack Sr. that have been previously undocumented by Freeman Ankrum and/or undocumented at the Brethren Archives in Elgin, IL.

As a descendant of George Mock (whom I originated the term "Soldier" Geo. Mock, because our family has his handwritten Rev. War Discharge, and cannot seem to prove who he is descended from), my cousins, Florence Kuhn Galassini, Venita Hurr Foster Herbert and I searched extensively through family legend that "Soldier" George Mock is a descendant of Alexander Mack Sr. We followed much info in legal deeds, wills, etc., migration patterns, followers of Alex. Mack Sr., whose surnames still occur in every residence area the descendants have lived and old photos of many of our relatives still wearing the old German Baptist brethren/ Dunker/Tunker/ Church of the Brethren garb. Everything circumstantial and legal fits the family legend of descendancy, however we could never prove or deduce which line. I have always felt there were missing lines and wish the male descendants had been traced more thoroughly.

This discovery shows that there is much work to do in Alex. Mack Sr.'s lines, and it appears one must spend much time in each migration location doing individual work to further discover additional lines and info. On Alex. Mack Sr's. descendants.

Our research on "Soldier" George Mock's Rev. War service was both exhilarating because we were able to pinpoint his regiment and tour of service in a great amount of detail, which correlated to the family legend, and was confusing because the Dunkers were pacifists.

I would guess there are several of us who would love hearing more of Alex. Mack's descendants. I have accumulated a tremendous amount of material on several of his known descendants just to eliminate lines other than ours. I do not have a computer or e-mail nor the time at this stage of my life to sort through and submit the info., but a great deal was obtained from interviewing cousins and looking at their prvately held documents, county records, LDS records, individual auto trips to PA and OH, Newberry Library in Chicago and the Brethren Archives in Elgin, IL

I urge you to forward your article on Daughters of

Johannes Valentin Mack to the Brethren Archives, as this was important info for them.

Queries Do Get Results!

Mr. Harold E. Mauk, Sr. of Leesburg, FL asked me to notify you that the query you published for me on Buell Emerson Mauk, Vol. VII, #4, pg 54] is his 1st cousin. He sent me a packet of information, just what I needed! Here is the letter that Harold sent to Marianna:

Hi! I am a 1st cousin of Buell Emerson Mauk. I knew him fairly well back in the early 1930's. I believe he was killed in Missouri while operating a bulldozer. My father was named Harry Emerson Mauk and was the brother of Benjamin Franklin Mauk. I believe the Emerson in Buell's was named after my father. One summer I was Frank Mauk's helper at my father's sand pit. We pumped all the sand for a huge wheat elevator in Hutchinson, KS (my hometown). Frank was an excellent mechanic. He operated steam threshing machines and steam paving rollers all over Kansas and Oklahoma. He and Salina's home was in Augusta, KS in the 1900's. Gilbert Mauk, Frank's father, Frank, Homer Mauk, (Frank's half brother) and Jacob Wilson (husband of Abby Mauk Wilson) made the run in the Cherokee strip and homesteaded land in 1893. My father was too young to homestead, but made the run with them. I also knew all of Frank Mauk's children except Opal who died before I was born.

I am sending extracted sheets from a book I wrote and published in 1975, *Descendents of Gottlieb Mauk*. You may find a copy in the Morman Library in SLC. ...I am also sending a copy of some of Gottliebs descendants

from records. You will find Buell's father, grandfather, g grandfather and gg grandfather in the enclosed info.

You have hit a geneology jackpot and it would please me if you would notify Barbara Dittig of the results of the query in the MFH.

While attending the Mock Conference last fall, I found a book in an antique shop in Gettysburg, PA: The Twenty-First Missouri-From the Home Guard to Union Regiment by Leslie Anders, Greenwood Press (1975). The book is based upon a publication written in 1899 by survivors of the 21st MO. Naturally I bought it! It has a good index.

On page 248 the book mentions my great-grandfather's brother, Matthew Mauck and his cousin Rueben Mauck and some of their escapades. Wolph's Descendants of Peter Mauck, on page III G-60 (217) clearly identifies a Rueben Wright Mauck, b. 1 March 1843 Mauckport, IN as serving in the MO Infantry Volunteers, later moving to Clark Co. Missouri and later still to Plainview, MO. My Mauck family lore also claimed this Rueben Mauck family into the 1930's when Matthew Mauck died. It seems that some research is in order to determine if there are two Rueben Maucks, one of whom may be descended from Joseph Mauck of Meigs Co., OH. The 21st MO was comprised of the 2nd Ohio and the 1st Missouri home guards.

Andrew Mock of Davie Co., NC

I'm still wading through all the info that I gathered in NC after the Mock Conference was over. Thought the following might be of interest:

1785, Andrew MOCK bought 250 acres of land from Casper SAIN, on waters of Bear Creek. He sold 53 3/4 acres in 1795 and sold the remaining 196 1/4 acres in 1798 after he had moved to TN. This was the land that was referred to as "Mock's Old Field" in 1810, and which later became known as "Mocksville", between 1823-1826.

Although there are no known records of land owned by a MOCK prior to 1785, Andrew MOCK's name is found in a list of 160 persons called before the Rowan Co. Court in 1783,"...to show cause why their estates should not be confiscated..." for TORY sympathy during the Revolutionary War.

This information is found in the book, The History of Davie County in the Forks of the Yadkin by James W. Wall, first published in 1969.

In a letter written in Oct 1989 by Doris B. FRYE, Reference librarian at the Davie Co. Public Library, Mocksville, NC, she writes, "Andrew MOCK was here early and then moved to Sullivan Co., TN in 1798. The MOCK who are here now moved into Davie Co. from Virginia. That information is what we have the most of and they may have been related to Andrew MOCK. He came with the Lutheran Germans from the Palatinate section of Germany and was a member of the Heidelburg Church here. He is listed as, 'Andreas MACK and wife on the church rolls.

Also enclosed, a copy of early marriages which show John Mock marrying Nancy Nine. After John's death, Nancy marries Mathias Strine. I don't know where the Kosciusko Co. Historical Society obtained these papers.

John Mock died 9 Aug 1865, typhoid, at 55 years. Born in Loudoun, farmer. Parents are Henry and Barbara Mock. Reported by John VERTS, friend.

Bob MOCK of Delaware posted the following to Mock-Gen-L on Dec. 5, 1996:

"I did find in Leesburg another information source that points me toward Henry & Barbary as being the parents of Thomas J. Mock. I found a secondary publication by Charles Blair Tavenner, Charles Blair Tavenner Collection, Family Papers, that shows Thomas as being a son to #38, which is Henry MOCK, m. to Barbary WERTZ. I also found a group record on file at the Balch Library under Conrad and Maria Barbara BINNS. Child number 8 of this record lists Barbary WERTZ as being married to Henry MACK (MOCK). The sources are listed as: L.E. Church Records - Fred. Md., 1785. Lo. Co. Tith List, 1784 Lo. Co. Tith List, Lo. Co. Deeds 1787."

Pat DUNCAN is descended from a Mary VIRTS, possible maiden name MOCK. Here is part of her email correspondence to Steve Lapp on 4 Apr 1996. "I have information from another WERTZ/VIRTS researcher that MOCK was the surname of my Mary but he cited no proof. Since that VIRTS line had been in Loudoun Co. for awhile and many members of that group belonged to the New Jerusalem Luther Church, MOCK or MACK is a good possibility. Having taken three years of German in high school I am aware of the speech/written language problems that arise. Please note in the following that the first child of John and Mary MOCK

VIRTS was named William Henry. John's father was named Wilhelm (William) so possibly the Henry is for Mary's father.

The only information I have about a possible MOCK/MACK is about my one family:

Johannes (John) VIRTS (25 Aug 1797 Loudoun Co. VA - 23 Jun 1872 Loudoun Co.VA) m. on unknown date at unknown location.

Mary MOCK (2 Feb 1800 VA - 30 Aug 1873 Loudoun Co. VA)

Both are buried at Waterford Union Cemetery. Death records kept by Burr W. Paxson dated 25 Jul 1884 lists: Jun 19, 1872 John Virts age 75 yrs. (gangreen). Aug 31, 1873 Mrs. John Virts age 73."

Editor's comments:

Please note that these Wirtz names match some of the sponsors of Henry and Barbara MOCK's children. Mary MOCK married to John VIRTZ is possibly a sister to Henry MOCK married to Barbara Virtz, or some close relation.

Also we have long speculated that Henry MOCK of Lovettsville, Loudoun Co. VA is a brother of Jacob MOCK of Waterford, Loudoun Co. VA. Henry and Jacob MOCK both appear in the 1820 Census for Loudoun Co. as Heads of Households, along with a Daniel MOCK born about 1798. Thus Daniel could also be a sibling.

Some have claimed that the parents of at least Jacob MOCK are Thomas and Sarah MACK of Frederick Co. MD, but I believe close examination of the evidence disproves this theory. New evidence is definitely needed to discover the ancestry of these MOCKS.



The Mocks and Ruddells of Bourbon and Boone Co., KY

I believe I have finally figured out the lineage of the Boone Co., KY Mocks. With the help of "Family Tree Maker" which shows **Joseph Mock** married to **Elizabeth Ruddell**.

It is believed that Joseph was a son of Rudolph Mauk whose will is dated 14 Apr 1817 Bourbon Co., KY and Catherine Ulrich.

There was no date given for Joseph's birth, but Elizabeth was born 23 August 1779. The marriage of JosephMock and Elizabeth Ruddell is given as 12 Mar 1811 in Bourbon Co. Their five children listed are:

Census Records for Joseph Mock and family are as follows:

1810 KY Census, Bourbon Co. has Joseph Mock, age 16-26. Also listed on the same page are Andrew, Jacob, Rudolph & Rudolph Sr.

1820 Joseph is listed in Boone Co, age 26-45, 1 male under 10, 1 male 16-26 (this child could not be a son of Joseph & Elizabeth, since they'd only been married 9 years); 2 females under 10 and 1 female 26-45

1830 Joseph is listed in Boone Co. age 40-50, 1 male 15-20; 1 female under 5, 1 female 5-10; 1 female 10-15, 1 female 15-20, 1 female 40-50

1840 Boone Co., KY, pg. 279, Joseph Mock, age 50-60. No children or wife listed; living next to Philip Cayton.

On page 278, Stephen Mock, age 20-30, 2 females under 5, 1 female 20-30, living next door to Cornelius Ruddle.

The 1850 Census, Boone Co. lists Stephen Mock, age 36, farmer, b. KY, Sarah 35, Mary J. 13, Emily 11, Martha 4, Madaline 8 & George 5, all born in KY. Joseph is no longer listed in Boone Co. There are two Joseph Mucks in Estill Co. KY (pg. 101), but I don't believe his identity has been determined.

Elizabeth was the daughter of James Ruddell and Jane "Jennie" Mulherin Ruddell, widow of Cornelius Ruddell who was the son of Captain Isaac Ruddle.

James Ruddell, born 20 August 1758 in Shenandoah Co., VA. was a son of Archibald Ruddell who was a very prominent pioneer and frontiersman in the Shenandoah Valley. He was the officer in charge of a regiment which included four Mauck boys in Frederick Co., VA in the early 1760's and this was one of the earliest references to sons of Rudolph Mauck (I) which included Daniel, Rudolph (II), Henry and Richard (We have not been able to identify Richard).

The Ruddell's lived all over the Shenandoah Valley but owned property in Rockingham Co., not far from where Rudolph Mauk II lived before moving to Kentucky Territory in 1787.

Archibald Ruddell was also the father of Isaac Ruddell who established Ruddell's Fort in the area that later became Bourbon County, KY. This is one of the most interesting stories of the Revolutionary War; how the British lead by a General Byrd, came down from the Detroit area, which was then a part of Canada, and brought cannons and other heavy artillery over land and by boat. They even mustered Indians to help and made a surprise attack on the Fort and one or two other fortresses in the area, and took many of the inhabitants prisioners, including women and children. Many were marched back to Detroit which was over 600 miles. Some were killed and the buildings were burned and destroyed. Isaac's son, Stephen was captured by the Shawnee Indians living in the area of Chillicothe, OH at the time. He was adopted by the family of Tecumseh and was about the same age as Tecumseh. They grew up together and in later years after being released to return to his family in KY, he continued to be friendly with the Indians and maintained contact with Tecumseh. This is one of the few inland skirmishes that occurred on the Frontier during the Revolutionary War.

The Mocks and Ruddells were closely associated in Rockingham Co., VA as well as Bourbon Co., KY. There were quite a number of Rockingham Co., VA families that all left around 1787 to settle in the Bourbon Co. area. These included the Custer, Ruddells, Birds, Humbles, Mauks, Caines, Kipplingers and many others. Many of these families intermarried with our Mocks.

There are members of the Mock discussion group on the Internet as well as our editor, Barbara Dittig who are fortunate to be descended from such a prominent pioneer and frontier family as The Ruddells. Barbara's ggg grandmother was Diana Ruddell, daughter of George Ruddell. She married George Mock 20 Aug. 1817 in BourbonCo. George, born 1794 Bourbon Co, was a son of Jacob Mauk and Mary "Polly" Payne. Jacob was a son of Rudolph II. and Catherine Mauk.

Little is known about the Joseph Mock family and further research could help clear up some of the many questions still unsolved about the Mocks of Kentucky and where they went from there.
