EARLY CHURCH RECORDS OF THE MAUKS: Rev. Johann Caspar Stoever Baptisms and Marriages

Among the earliest notations of Mauks in colonial Virginia and Pennsylvania are those found in the Baptismal and Marriage records of Rev. Johann Caspar Stoever. Rev. Stoever and his father Rev. Johann Caspar Stoever Sr. arrived in Philadelphia Sept. 11, 1728 from the The father ministered to Lutheran immigrants in Palatine in Germany. Spotsylvania Co., VA from approx. 1733 to 1737. The son, ordained 1733 Philadelphia, helped establish and serve Lutheran throughout early PA. until his death 13 May 1779. Johann Caspar Stoever Jr. kept a concise journal of baptisms and marriages performed from 1730 to 1779. These records were first translated from their original German script into English in 1896 and published at Harrisburg, PA. They were last reprinted by Genealogical Publishing Co. of Baltimore. MD in 1988 and are still available under the title EARLY LUTHERAN BAPTISMS AND MARRIAGES IN SOUTHEASTERN PENNSYLVANIA -The Records of Rev. John Caspar Stoever from 1730 to 1779.

Quite a few of Stoever's early baptisms and marriages were performed in isolated German communities or homesteads of frontier Virginia. It is here we find our most revealing Mauk references:

Page 11 - RUDI MAAG, (Opequon)
Maag-Elizabetha, b.1Nov1735; bap.2May1736
Sponsors, Carl Ehrhardt & Susanna Barbara Buger

Page 13 - PETER MAAG, (Opequon)
Maag-Johannes, b.25Nov1739; bap.29Apr1740
Sponsor, Abraham Weissmann

Page 57 - 1739, April 30 - Peter Maag & Juliana Rheinhart Opecken in Orange Co., VA.

Opequon refers to those homesteads on or near the Opequon Creek in early Orange Co., VA (near the present day town of Winchester). Dr. Moore referred to the above RUDI and PETER in his editorial in the first issue of the MOCK FAMILY HISTORIAN. The MAAG spelling occurs in many of the early records, including ship lists and Palatine church books. As late as 1785 Daniel Mauk signed his name as "Daniel Mag" on land records, although the clerk wrote his wife's name as "Peggy Mauk". (This is the Daniel Mauk who married first to Barbara Harnsberger in Culpepper Co., VA and second to Rebecca Baker in Shenandoah Co., VA.) Daniel died in the town of Hamburg, VA. in Jan. 1803. Many researchers have speculated that this Daniel is a son of the above RUDI MAAG, but no conclusive evidence has been established.

There are several other MAAGs and MACKs in Stoever's records. These have been largely ignored because their relationship has not been established. However, they are of interest:

Page 71 - 1766, Sept 30 - Conrad Hornberger & Catarina Maag, Bethel.

Bethel was an early settlement in Pennsylvania. Other Lutheran and Reformed Church records of PA for the eighteenth century contain many names spelled MAAG. Perhaps a definitive study of these will someday establish their relationship.

Page 53 - 1733, Oct.15 - Hieronymus Glantz & Erna Barbara Mack, Philadelphia.

1730, Oct.27 - John Kitzmueller, Sr. & Margaretha Mack, Earl

Town, PA.

1731, June 5 - John Kitzmueller, Jr. & Philippina Christian

Mack, Earl

Town, PA.

Of these last two brides, they were likely related. Anna Margaretha Mack and Philippina Mack appear together on the passenger list of the ship Allen, dated 15Sept1729. On the same list we also find Alexander Mack and his three sons. This is the Alexander Mack who founded the Church of the Brethren (Dunkers). It seems likely he is related to these Mack women, but other reference to them has not been found. (Ship list is found in Strassburger-Hinke's Pennsylvania German Pioneers, pg.29-30.)

When the original Stoever record book was translated in 1896, the first four pages were missing. They have since been found among papers of the Gratz Collection at the Historical Society of Pennsylvania. Although they have never been published, they were translated by Paul Bleyden and a copy of the translation was fastened into the 1896 volume which resides in the reading room of the Historical Society. A copy of these unpublished "lost" pages can be obtained directly from the Historical Society of Pennsylvania for \$15.00, or for \$2.00 Steve Lapp will gladly reproduce his copy: Steve Lapp, 98 Whitney St., San Francisco, CA 94131.

These "lost" pages are baptisms from 29Nov1729 to 28Nov1738. The only names like MOCK or MACK that appear in these pages are:

Fourth Page, second from the last entry -

1729 in August Son Alexander Alexander Maky at Manatawny
1731 in March Dau Catharine Alexander Maky at Manatawny
Both baptised 30ct1731 - Sureties were the parents.

(Manatawny is in Pennsylvania)

WHICH GEORGE IS WHO ????

In past written histories, the GEORGE MOCK/MACKs of early Pennsylvania have often been confused and mixed up with each other. Indeed, the records are so few and incomplete that the researcher is reluctant to attempt a clarification. Two such GEORGE MACKs lived within 25 miles of each other during the mid 1700s - one in York Co.,PA near the present town of York, and the other in Warwick Township, Lancaster Co.,PA near present day Brickerville.

Venita Hurr Foster (a current subscriber to MOCK FAMILY HISTORIAN) obtained baptismal records from the York Co. Historical Society which firmly establish the family members of GEORGE and MARIA EVA MACK. The following baptisms are from Christ Lutheran Church:

- A. John George Mark(?) or Mack born 7Nov1749, bapt. 26Nov Parents John and Magdalena Mark(?) or Mack Sponsors George Kuehns and wife Mary Elizabeth
- 1. Jacob Mack born 180ct1772, bapt. 250ct
 Parents John George and Eva Mack
 Sponsors Jacob Smyser and wife
- Magdalena Mack born 26Dec1774, bapt. 12Mar1775
 Parents George and Eva Mack Sponsors George Beck and wife
- 3. John George Mack born 26Feb1778, bapt. 8Mar Parents John George Mack and Eva Sponsors Jacob Smyser and wife
- 4. John Mack born 03Nov1779, bapt. 30Apr1780
 Parents George Mack and Eva
 Sponsors George Burk and wife
- 5. Michael Mack born 27May1782, bapt. 02June Parents John George Mack (mother not listed). Sponsor Catharine Jacoby
- 6. Mary Magdalen Mack born 30May1789, bapt. 09Nov Parents George Mack and Eva Sponsor Magdalen Schrist (Sechrist?)

The above family members are confirmed in the will of George Mock dated O8Jan1810 and filed in Bedford Co,PA. This George Mock served in the Revolutionary War. Please refer to Venita Foster's book, <u>CLIMB</u> WITH ME....

MY FAMILY TREE, published in 1989. It has not been confirmed that the George Mack born 07Nov1749 is the same George above married to Eva.

From the Emanuel Lutheran Church records and civil records from Warwick Township in Lancaster Co.,PA we find the following, in Chronological order:

1756 - Henry Mock is taxable in Warwick Township.

1759 - Heinrich and Margaret Mock sponsor a Stover child in bapt.

1760 - Heinrich and Margaret Mock sponsor Eichelberger child.

1761 - George Mock married Sophia Miller on April 21. (maybe Sophia Muller, 1738 immigrant on Ship Glasgow-Edit.)

- 1762 Sept. 10 dau. Catharina born, sponsors in bpt were Heinrich Mock and Catharine Muller.
- 1771 Jan. 5 son George born, sponsors in baptism were Jacob Muller and wife Anna Maria.
- 1761 Henry Moke from Warwick Township was naturalized March 30

From Heidelberg Reformed Church in Schaefferstown, Lebanon Co.,PA (approx 8 miles at most from Warwick Township) we find the following children of Henry and Eva Mock:

John George Mock b. 25Feb1773 - sponsors George and Sophia Mock.

Adam Mock b. 1766 Philip Mock b. 1777

Henry and Elizabeth also, birthdates not listed.

1785 - Henry and Eva Mogg sponsor Herchelroth daughter in baptism.

We all can speculate on the relationships suggested by the above information, but hopefully more substantial data will be forthcoming from MOCK FAMILY HISTORIAN readers and researchers.

One final note: several researchers in the past have claimed that each of the GEORGE MACKs from the above two families was the immigrant aboard the ship Rawley, which was received in Philadelphia 230ct1752. This group of Palatines was headed by the Lutheran minister John George Bager (first on ship list) who preached for many years at Hanover in York Co.,PA. From the "Adolph Gerber Lists of Emigrants from Wuerttemberg" we find GEORG MACK:

Journeyman weaver. Son of the Justiciary and weaver Johann Heinrich Mack at Laiehingen. Wf: Anna Maria Hail, daughter of the shoemaker Johannes Hail. Ch. (1) Johann Heinrich, b. 8-24-1745; (2) last child b. 1749, died young. "Ludwigsburg Protocol", 4-21-1752, to "Pennsylvania."// HANS JORG MOCK, "Rawley", Oct. 23 1752.

(Johannes Heil was also aboard Rawley, as well as Jorg Heil.)

This is a small part of the 30 large binders & roladex of some 10,000 names of the Zumwalt family history, compiled over some 30 years by George Zumwalt. When he died about 1985 the family gave this collection to our library.

Delilah Zumwalt, daughter of the immigrant Andrew Zumwalt married a Mauck so we have mostly this branch of the family. Anyone interested in information on this family, please send a long S.A.S.E. and \$5. for research.

May I warn you that these family group sheets were sent to Mr. Zumwalt by other family and researchers so we do not claim authenticity. However, it does give one a starting point to prove the info further.

In your newsletter, I see a query asking for the names of wife and children of John Mauck in 1789. There are several John Maucks, but I found the following which I hope you will pass on to Steve Lapp, your research coordinator: John MAUCK born 1761, died 1810

Married #1 Barbara Snarr on 27Dec1785 Married #2 Elizabeth Heiser on 9Apr1787 Children by second wife:

Joseph - b.7Sept1787, married Grace Broyles

Henry - no info, just his name

John - b.18Sept1797, married Elizabeth Conrad Samuel - b.1800 , married Mary Polly Broyles

The John Mauck b. 1761 was the son of John Mauck and Delilah Zumwalt. Delilah was the dau. of Andrew Zumalt (the immigrant) and 1st wife, Mary.

FOUND: - Another GEORGE! From new subscriber, Blanche Norris I am a descendant of George & Catherine (Snavely/Schnebly), Mock/Muck, Frederick Co., Md. (now Washington Co.) We believe George Mock was the Gorg Christoph Muck listed on the psgr. list of the Queen of Denmark out of Hamburg, Germany, arriving in Philadelphia, Nov. 1752. (He may have been the son of Johannes and Maria Maas, Pomerania. They also had a son Peter, who may have emigrated with kGeorge and could be the Peter on page 5 of the news letter. Peter was married ca 1767 and moved from Washington Co. to Bedford Co. in 1774. George had a son named Peter. Peter named two sons George and Christopher. George's son, Rhinehart also migrated to Bedford Co. My grand father told me about his father taking the family to Indiana to relatives with the idea of settling there - (somewhere on the Wabash River.) We had always assumed the relatives were descendants of Peter or Thinehart who had moved to Bedford Co. - no proof (1870s) Note: Peter would have been 7 years old in 1752 and 22 in 1767 if George and Peter were the sons of Johannes and Maria Maas.
