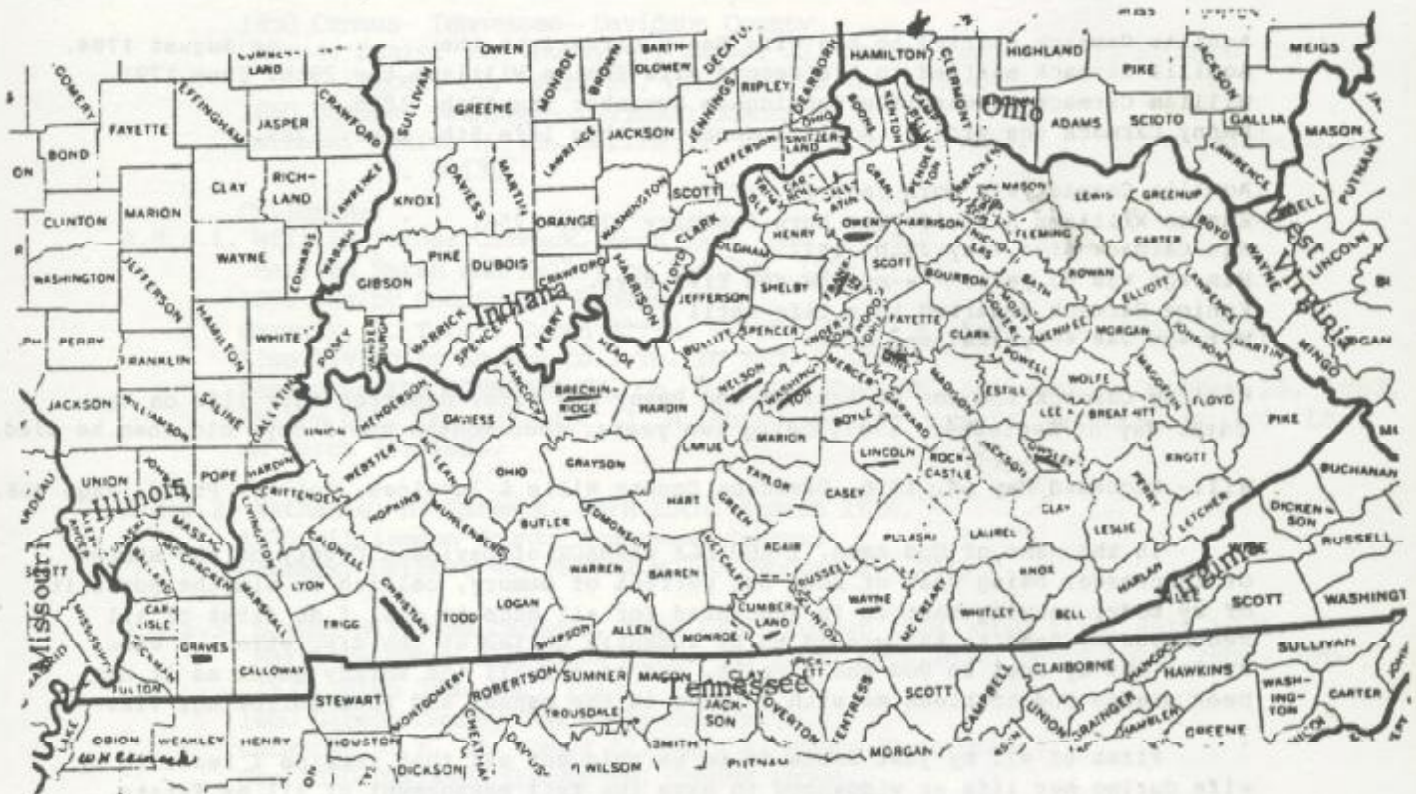

William Carmack the son of Aquilla and Benney his wife was born the 21st. of May 1785.

Daniel Carmack the son of Aquilla and his wife Eunice was born 29th. June 1795.

Harry (Henry) William Carmack the son of Aquilla and Eunice his wife was born 10th.
May 1797.

Samuel Carmack the son of Aquilla Carmack and Eunice his wife was born 9th. Jan. 1802.

Aquilla Carmack married to his wife Benny Cartwright the _____ of August 1784.

Aquilla Carmack married to his second wife Eunice Williams the 29th. June 1791.

William Carmack to Caroline Cunningham November the 10th. 1825.

Benny Carmack the wife of Aquilla departed this life 5th. Sept. 1785.

Aquilla Carmack was born Jany 13, 1754.

Eunice Williams his wife was born February 17th. 1756.

His age was 63 years ----months and five days.

William Carmack the son of Aquilla and Benny his wife, departed this life on the
24th. day of September, 1787, being two years, four months and 3 days old when he died.

Will- Recorded May 14, 1816, Davidson County Wills & Invoices, Vol. 6, Pt. 2, Page 458.

In the name of God Amen, I AQUILLA CARMACK of Davidson County of the state
of Tennessee, being weak of body but perfect of memory, calling to mind the mortality
of my body, knowing that it is appointed for all once to die, I do first of all
recommend my body to the ground to be decently buried at the discretion of exec-
utors, and my soul to God who gave it, and as for all the worldly goods as it has
been please God to bless me with I leave in the manner and form following, Viz.

First of all my just debts is to be paid and all that remains I leave to my
wife during her life or widowhood to have the full management of all my Estate,
Real and Personal. Then to be equally divided amongst my three sons; Daniel (White);
William (Henry); and Samuel (Williams) Carmack, and I leave Oliver Williams of
Williamson and Robert Buly of Davidson County to execute this my last will and
testament declaring all former wills to be void and this I witness as my last will
to this day August fifteenth Anno Domino one thousand eight hundred and seven.

SAMUEL WILLIAMS CARMACK, noted lawyer, lived in Fayetteville, Lincoln Co., TN, and then later at Tallahassee, FL. He died at Marianna, FL, and was buried there. He married Margaret Greer of Petersburg, TN, the daughter of Joseph Greer, the King Mountain Messenger. Joseph and his father, Andrew Greer, both fought for their country in the Revolutionary War. GEORGE CALL CARMACK, born at Tallahassee, FL, fought for the CONFEDERACY in the Civil War. He was active service two and ½ years. He was wounded in the battle of Murfreesboro, TN. and taken prisoner, he was carried to Nashville and imprisoned a short while, then sent to Rock Island Prison, where he remained until the end of the war.
- A.8.c.2. Judge Samuel William Carmack, born 1st. June 1847, died 3 Feb. 1892, was County Judge of Lincoln County, TN. 1884-1892, Graduated from Cumberland University Law School of Lebanon, TN. with high honors. Served under Forrest in the Civil War.

Jonathan Carmack of Campbell Co. Kentucky do hereby make my last will and testament in manner and form following. That is to say

1st. I desire that all the perishable part of my estate be immediately sold after my decease and out of the monies arising therefrom all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid. Should the perishable part of my property prove insufficient for the above purposes, then I desire that my executors herein named my sell as much out of the present tract of land adjoining Joseph ____ (Tharo?), William Riley and others as may satisfy such of my just debts as shall remain unpaid out of the sales of the perishable part of my estate.

2nd. After the payment of my funeral expenses, I give to my wife JANE CARMACK my black woman Maria for five years after which time I wish her to be freed or emancipated. Also one horse saddle and bridle, two cows, bed and bedding.

3rd. I also give one hundred acres of land which lies adjoining John Stephens, John Anderson, Elijah Herndon to JACOB CARMACK and WILLIAM CARMACK, my grandchildren, being the same tract of land their mother now lives on in Campbell Co. and State above named, never the less I wish MARY CARMACK my son WILLIAM's widow to occupy and have the benefit of the tract last named as long as she remains a widow if that should be her life time, at which time her sons above named is to inherit the same.

4th. On consideration that WASHINGTON BRYANT relinquishes all his interest in his father's estate to his brothers and sisters, I give one hundred acres of land to him that I purchased of James McClure on the east side of twelve mile creek adjoining Samuel Belisall (?) tract of land which if the above condition is not complied with, the above tract of land to be sold and divided equally amongst WASHINGTON, GEORGE H., WILLIAM, MORTIMORE and ELIZABETH BRYANT, heirs to SAMUEL BRYANT and children of my daughter CYNTHIA, both deceased.

5th. I wish John and Armistead, my two black boys at my decease to be sold to the highest bidder and to be applied to the payment of my just debts. Also if the above named property both personal and real should not be sufficient to pay off all my debts, then in that event so much of the Lyon (?) tract of land containing one hundred and ninety two acres and a half which tract adjoins the tract I now live on in the County and State above named, shall be sold to pay off the same and if then should be any balance left, the same to be divided equally between JOHN ANDERSON and EDWARD MORIN my sons-in-law.

6th. I will my black girl Ann to my granddaughter, ELEN, daughter of my son G. Washington Carmack.

7th. I give the place or tract I now live on known to be the tract I purchased of Kimbo (?) containing two hundred and sixty one acres of land, the same lying on twelve mile or Wells Creek and adjoining Prewits Survey to G. WASHINGTON CARMACK, my youngest son, The last named tract of land. I will all others named in this my last will and testament his in Campbell County Kentucky. It is understood that if the personal property in the Prewit tract of land and the black boy Armistead is sufficient to pay all debts then GEORGE W. CARMACK is to inherit the black boy John. But if after the sale of the personal property the Prewit tract of land and the boy Armistead there should be a balance after the debts are paid,, the same to be equally divided between GEORGE W. CARMACK, JOHN ANDERSON and EDWARD MORIN and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint GEORGE W. CARMACK and EDWARD MORIN executors of this my last will and testament. In witness where of I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 13th day of Feb. 1843

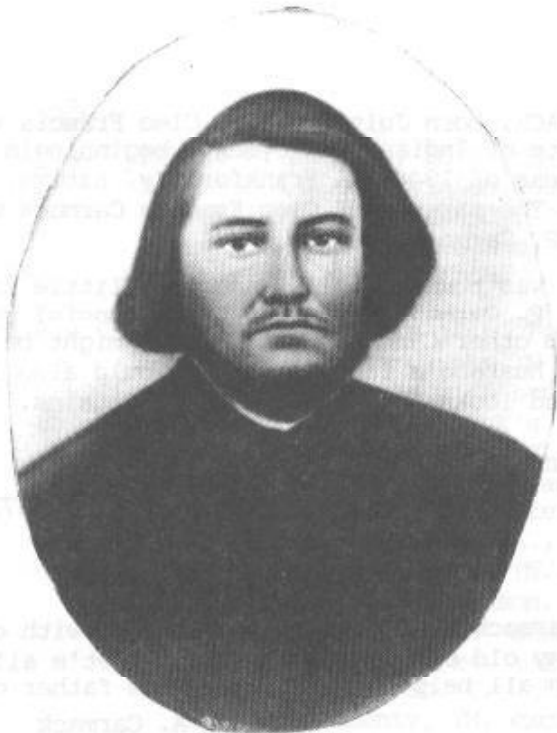

David R. Carmack was born 3rd. December 1844 in Lee County, Iowa. When he was 17 years old he enrolled in the CONFEDERATE ARMY, 4th. August 1862. He was assigned to Capt. Thomas K. Carmack's (his brother) Company, 1st. Batt'n. Texas Partisan Rangers, Stephenville, TX. He was elected 4th. Corp. on 27th. September 1862. On 5th. May 1865 David R. Carmack and Amanda Henning were married.



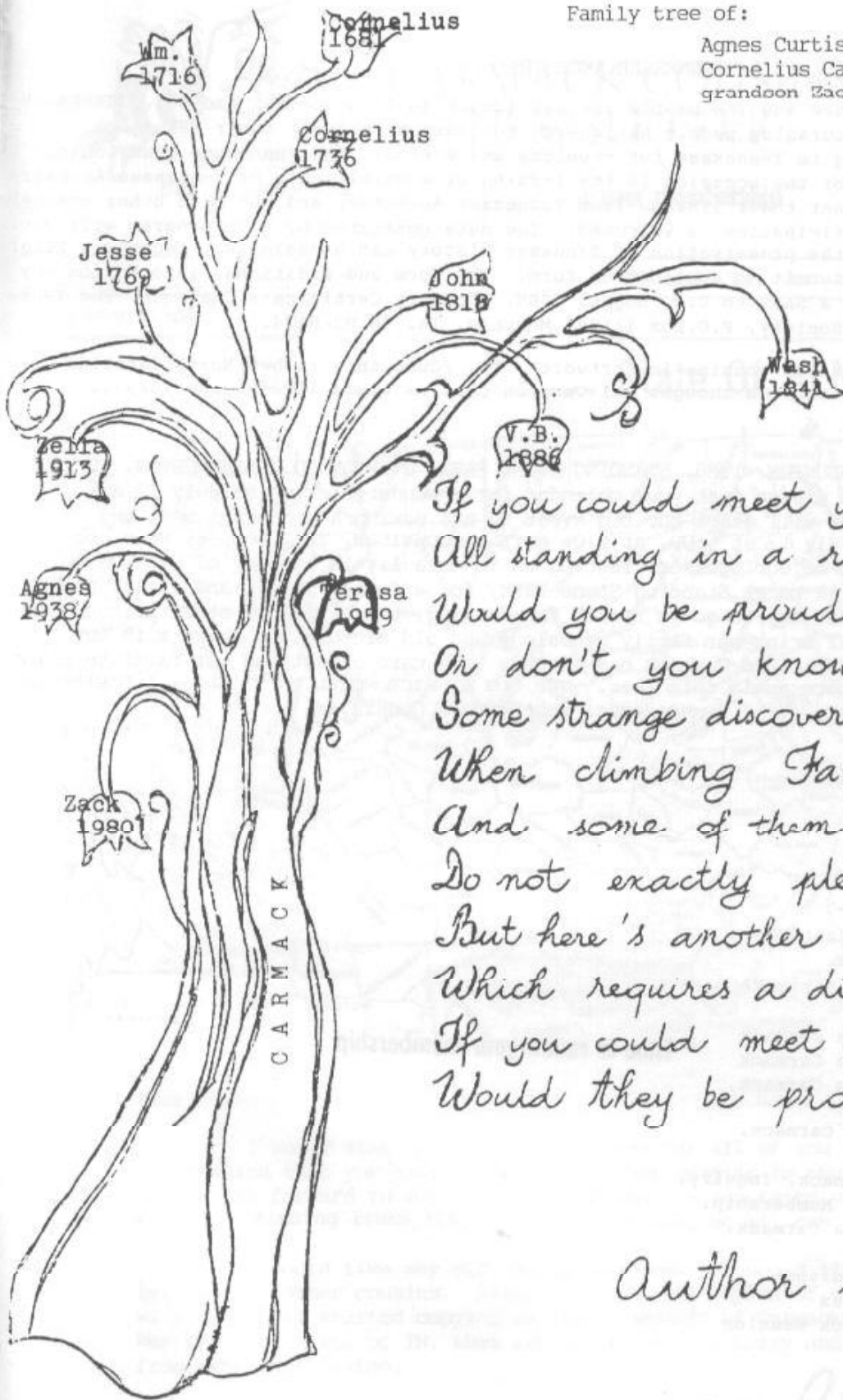
JANE CARMACK & JONATHAN THOMAS
