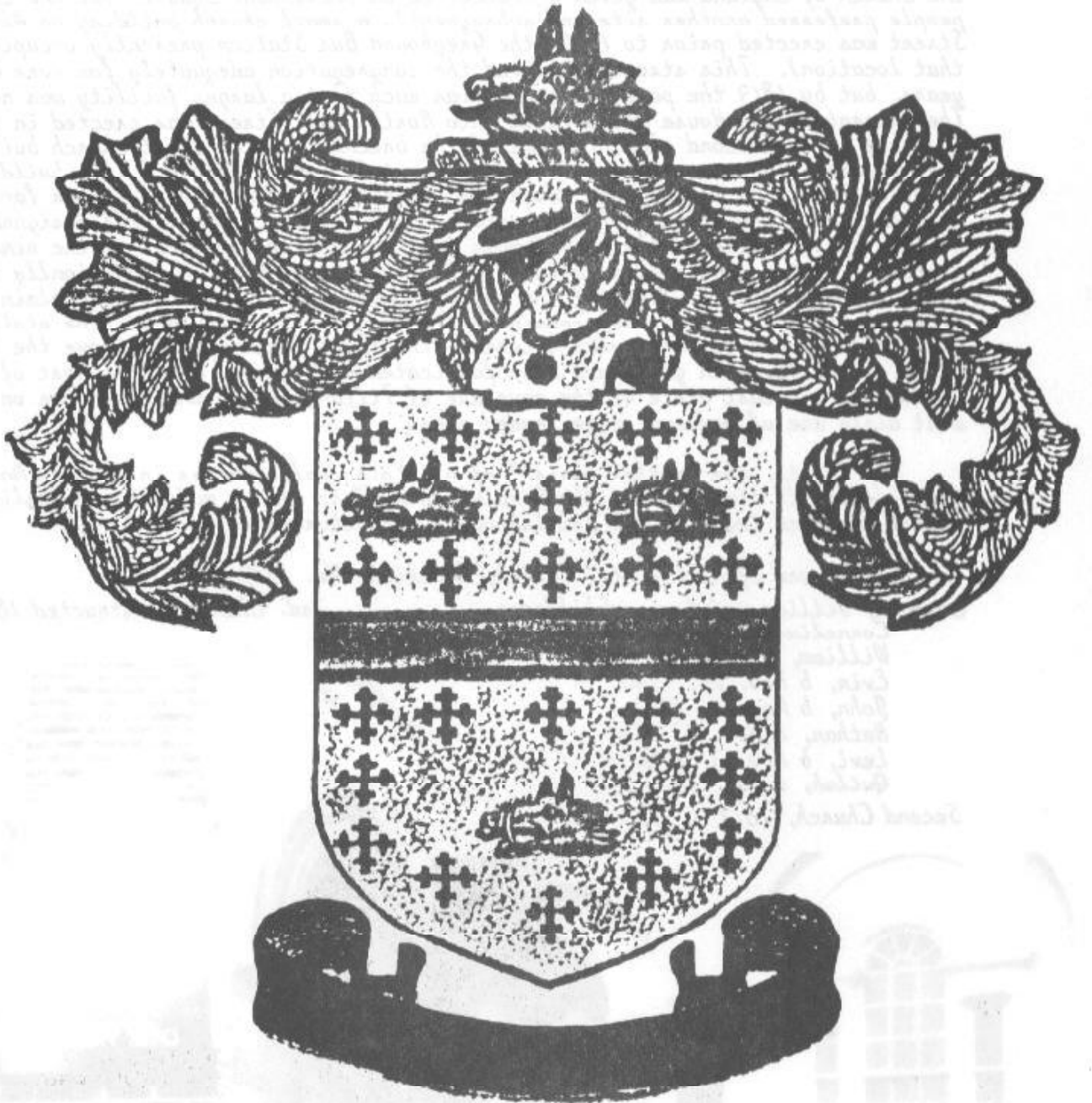

ALL SAINTS PARISH CHURCH
Federick, Maryland

All Saints Parish was organized in 1742 for the Church of England settlers in Federick Co., Maryland area. When the town of Federick was laid out in 1745 the Church of England was given a choice lot on Courthouse Square, but the church-people preferred another site and subsequently a small church building on All Saints Street was erected prior to 1750 (the Greyhound Bus Station presently occupies that location). This structure served the congregation adequately for over 60 years, but by 1813 the parish's growth was such that a larger facility was needed. The present Parish House which faces onto North Court Street was erected in 1813 to serve as the second church. Some of the bricks from the first church building were incorporated into the fabric of the Court Street structure. This building provided ideal for worship and education until 1854, when an even larger facility was required. The present church building on West Church Street was designed by Richard Upjohn, perhaps the most famous American church architect of the nineteenth century. It was constructed in 1854-1855 at a cost of \$28,800. Originally there was a choir gallery in front of the organ chamber and the windows were plain colored glass, but the building today remains basically as it was in 1855. The stained glass windows are of particular interest- the three large windows above the high altar are of Bavarian glass and were fabricated by Meyer of Munich. Most of the windows on the east aisle of the nave are of Tiffany glass, while windows on the west aisle are of medieval type leaded glass.

All Saints, the "mother parish" of all Episcopal churches in western Maryland, faced difficult times during the Revolutionary War, when a majority of Anglican priest remained loyal to the British cause and returned to England.

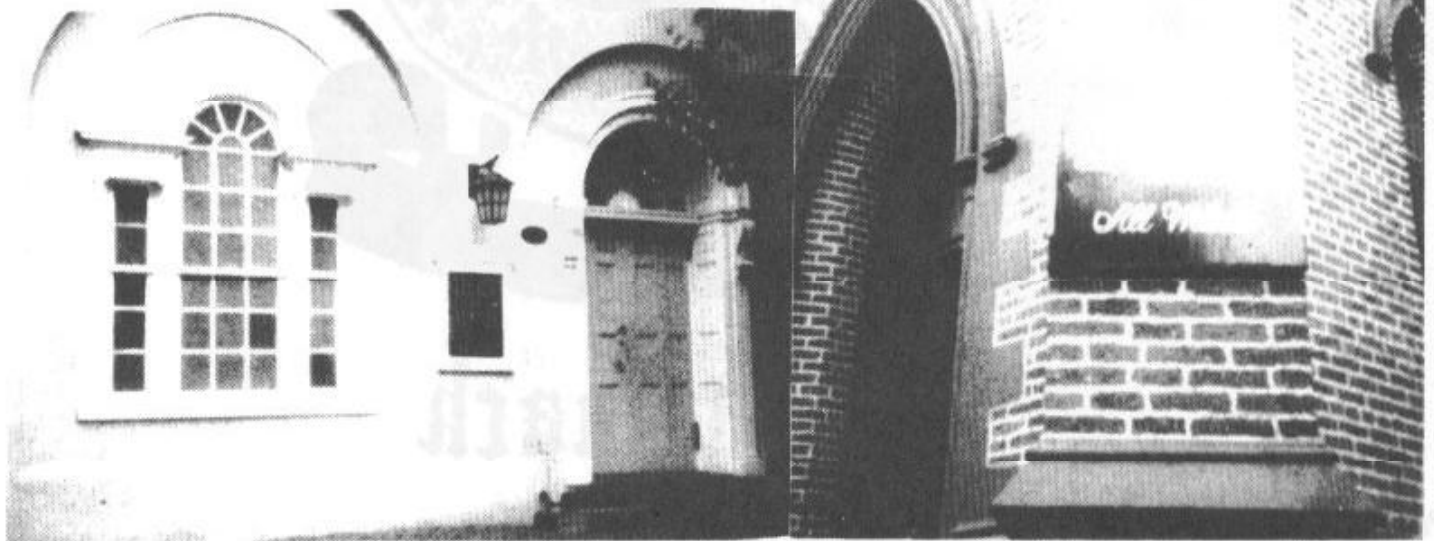

DEATH- Dr. James Carmack, born July 9, 1897, died April 12, 1987, Redlands, Ca. See CARMACK COUSINS Vol. 1, No. 3, "School for the Handicap" dedicated to Dr. J. C. Carmack. Carmack Cousins first issue was printed September 1, 1984, J. C. was one of our first cousins to join. Son of Columbus Fawcett Carmack, born Erath Co., Tx., died in San Fernando, Ca., Grandson of John Wesley Carmack and Susan Carr who left Overton Co., Tn. in 1828. J. C. was an Orthopedic surgeon for 35 years, a member of St. Paul's United Methodist Church. From being a school teacher to having a school named for him, spans the long and productive professional career of Dr. J. C. Carmack. He enjoyed retirement and looked back with satisfaction on the generations of children who benefited by both his medical and teaching skills.

William Joe Carmack, son of Edwin Carmack, Halls, Tn.
In 1958 Joe graduated from Lauderdale county high school,
then on to the University of Tennessee at Martin.

After graduation at Martin Joe left Lauderdale County, Tn., leaving most of his family which he has made numerous visits to see. Joe's family being rural people who farm and work in skilled and professional (teachers) jobs. The family are all members of the Church of Christ.

In 1963 Joe left the University of Tennessee at Knoxville with a double major, one in agricultural engineering and second in civil engineering, he was employed by the US Department of Agriculture, Soil Conservation Service (SCS) and has continued in SCS employment to this day. While in Tennessee he worked on a wide range of engineering activities mostly dealing with soil erosion and flooding.

Joe's first opportunity came to work outside the USA in 1976 when he was invited to go to Swazi Land as an erosion control specialist for three months. Joe had American supervisor there who frequently said "this is just like walking through the pages of National Geographic." Swazi Land a land locked country located to the East of the Republic of South Africa.

In 1978 Joe was offered a promotion and transfer as the SCS State Engineer in Washington State. He became heavily involved in reclamation work following the eruption on Mt. Saint Helens in 1980, which was most interesting within itself and led to his second foreign assignment with SCS which was a scientific exchange with Costa Rica, brief but very interesting since Costa Ricans had a lot more experience dealing with volcanic eruptions. While in Washington state Joe became involved in irrigation which led him to his current assignment in Egypt.

In 1983 Joe and his family decided to accept a two year deal for SCS to the US Agency for International Development (USAID) in Egypt. After going through culture shock several times, Joe wanted his family also to experience life outside the USA. The experience has proven to be an educational one to the whole family and in 1985 they extended two additional years, and just recently extended again which means that they will be there until 1989. Joe and his family have enjoyed and like the Egyptian people very much.

Work in Egypt has been that of an irrigation specialist with USAID but a larger portion of his time is spent with the Government of Egypt (GOE) Ministry of Irrigation (MOI). The MOI is a cabinet level of the GOE that is responsible for the distribution of the waters of the Nile River. The importance of this Ministry is highlighted by the fact Egypt is a desert country of 50 million people totally dependent upon a single source of water, the Nile. The economy is basically agricultural but it produces less than half of it's food needs.

The aid program that Joe is working with is directly a product of the Camp David Accords signed by President Jimmy Carter and Anwar Sadat.

Joe and his family also have a group of people meeting at his home for worship, which consist of an Arabic speaking congregation and an English speaking group. The "home church" consist of four or five American families that are in Cairo with oil companies, contractors, the military and other endeavors.

One of the things Joe and his family have enjoyed about being in the Middle East is their travel opportunities, so far they have had the experience of visiting London, Rome, Athens, Cyprus, Jordan, Israel, Tunisia, and Turkey.

After our experience with crab back to the motel, Shirley Hardin, and Edie staying and visiting with us.

Friday, May 14, Up out of the bed a quick breakfast and off to the All Saints Parish Church, this was a a real treat for all of us as some of our ancestors were baptized at All Saints Parish Church, the church we were able to see was the third church built, our family being baptized in the first church. This church is a beautiful church. After leaving the church on to the courthouse, where we split up, part in land records and part in wills, we keep the copying machines pretty busy. After a quick lunch off to Libertytown where Cornelius decided to settle with his two sons, William & John. Shirley Hardin had told Sue the night before that their John (son of Cornelius 1681) house of entertainment was where the bank stands today in Libertytown, (picture of bank), on arriving at the bank everyone jumped out of our car's and started taking picture, Harry latter informed us that the people were looking out the windows at us, I guess they were wondering why the two car loads of women were taking pictures of their bank, probably thought we were "casing" their bank. Libertytown a tiny community, Cornelius and his two son's onced owned this part of Maryland. We were able to bring home some soil, and dirt from Libertytown.

Saturday, May 16, Another quick breakfast then off to the Historical Society, we goofed by not going on friday and found it closed on saturday. Off to Carmack Jay's grocery to buy food for our open house that afternoon. Joan Carmack came by and was so helpful in giving us her family information and family member to contact (another goof- we forgot to get Joan's picture so we had to leave her out of this newsletter but I will try to get a picture to use in latter issues). Marion and Eileen Carmack had ran a little late that afternoon, but came all excited, a new grandson was born that afternoon, son Robert has told us the day before he would be by to see us, but Benjamin Steiner was born that afternoon, another Carmack to carry on Marion's family line.

Saturday Family Dinner- 18 Carmack Cousins were able to get together at the Holiday Inn for a nice family dinner together, Billy & Betty Sells, Gambrills, Md. came (Betty granddaughter of Lucy Carmack, sister to my grandfather), Marion and Eileen Carmack, James & Carolee Carmack (Marion's brother), Woody Carmack, daughter and granddaughter. brother to Maxie, Gladys and Daisy. We all had a nice family dinner together. Mitzie and Daisy had ate at the table with Jim and Carolee, learning about their old and most interesting home, at Detour, Md. After dinner

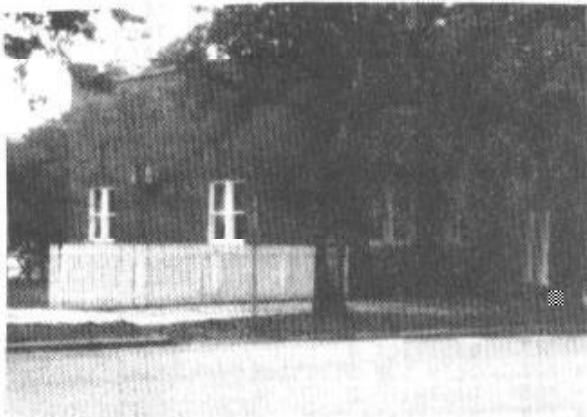
a trip to their home, Carolee had done such a good job in recdecoration this old house that dated back to early 1700's. One of the hills near Jim's and Carolee's farm was named CARMACK hill. Another Bledsoe mystery-For sometime everyone has been trying to find information on John Carmack, 1830 census shows in Bledsoe Co, Tn., this John being son of Cornelius and Margery Carmack. From information James has sent on 21 Feb. 1825 E. TN Land Grant #201 (Bk. 12, p. 596) to John Carmack, land in Bledsoe County on Cane Creek and Cumberland Mtn. Lewis Carmack also lived in Van Buren Co., TN. was on the 1850 Van Buren Co. Census, Samuel Carmack was in Coffee Co., Tn. in 1850. All of these people so close to the Carmacks in Overton Co., but we haven't been able to put all of these pieces of the puzzle together. If we could find someone with information of the above John Carmack, his children etc. I think we will be able to fill in a lot of missing links. I also think if we can find family of James Carmack, son of Bridgett and Dennis Carmack in Md. this will help other missing lines. If anyone finds any new information please let me know and I will send it on to the Cousins that we haven't been able to tie them in.
