Will of Levi Carmack

Probated 3 December 1875

In the name of God Amen, the nineteenth day of June one thousand seven hundred and eitahty-four. I, Levi Canmack of Frederick County and state of Manyland, being weak in body tho of a sound and perfect memony and understanding-----Loving wife. Susannah all my lands, goods and chattels until my son, Ephnim Canmack comes of age, then lands sold and divided between my three children, Ephniam. Catherine and Susannah.

Executors-----Wife, Susannah and brother William Carmack.

- A.7.a. Ephriam Carmack- (from files of Lillie Gruden Davis)- Ephraim(Ephriam) Carmack was born 20 May 1779 in Woodsboro, Maryland, the oldest child of Levi and Susannah Justice. He moved from Maryland to Crab Orchard, Kentuckey and then to Cincinnati, Ohio in 1802. There he met Sarah Brightwell, daughter or william and Mary Waddel and they were married about 1806. Their first four children were born Cincinnati; about 1814 they moved to Paddy's Run (now Shandon) Butler Co., Ohio. In 1834 the cholera epidemic spread thru Ohio and Ephraim lost his mother Susanna, his stepfather Frederick Benjamin White, his wife Sarah, one son and one daughter. Ephraim moved to Mercer Co., Ohio in 1844 where he died 14 April 1854. He is buried 2½ mi. west of Saint Henry, ¼ mi. North or wendelin, Ohio.

EPHRAIM CARMACK & Daughter CATHERINE

In the late 1700's in Manyland pant of the Canmack family convented to the Methodist faith, some of them regularly held meetings in their homes until congregations could be formed that could build a church-house.

Ephnaim Canmack was of that family. Born in 1779, his father died in 1785 and his mother mannied Benjamin White in 1790, having a large family of children in the order of that day. When Ephnaim attained his majority he sold his inheritance and with his mother, step-father, half brothers and sisters and some others in the numerous Canmack family, started for Ohio. Somewhere in Kentuckey, tradition says Crab Orchard, the family decided to split ways, some went into Pennsylvania and then to Licking County, Ohio then on to Wyandot County, some travelled to Tennessee and settled there. Ephnaim went on to finally settle in what is now Butler County, Ohio. Wistory says "He was a nulunal born teamster and distinguished in his cherished avocation. He brought with him a genuine conestoga wagon and a team of eight horses. He was also "mighty hunter" and seldom returned from his excursions without bringing many trophies of his skill in the chase. He removed with his family to Mercen County and was among the early pioneers of that section. "This same history relates that religious meetings were held in his home until a church and a regular preacher took over. He and one other man opened gravegards on their property where the reighbors could find "for their dead a sepulcher." In 1834 an epidemic of the "Asiatic Plague" swept the reighborhood and Ephnaim lost his wife, his mother, his step-father, one son and one daughter on consecutive days, five days and five deaths.

Ephnaim's children were reared in the Methodist faith. One daughten, Catherine Canmack, mannied in 1831, my great grandfather James Gruden(Lillie Gruden Davis). I have several receipts for quarterly dues of her membership in the Methodist Chruch, dated 1842 and 43. She in turn installed a Christian faith in her children.

My grandfather, the not the sanctimenious type of Christian, but was a calm, peace Loving man, he Lived his religion in every day life.

One of my deanest memonies is of visiting my grandparents. He died when I was seven. Everyone in his house, large on small, visitor on family, must arise for early Bible service before breakfast. On the farm that was early. Grandmother's kitchen was large and I well remember sitting quietly whild grandfather read a passage from the big Bible (which my brother now has), then grandfather prayed and it seemed a long prayer to the small children but was beautiful ever to us, and I would kneel by my chair, facing the east windows and watch the sun come up over the orchard, maybe that was what I liked most about grandfather's prayer. Then we all sat down at grandmother's table which seemed to accommodate all the family present, no matter how many there were. But before we could eat grandfather again must thank the lond for his watchful care through the night and ask for his continued care and quidance through the new day. Granumother continued that practice to her death at the age of 89. Whenever grandmother visited any of her children or grandchildren in their homes these blessings were greatfully acknowledged and asked to be continued. This is one of the shining jewels of my treasured stone of wonderful memonies. I can think of no greater heritage than this, the memony of a strong and steadfast faith, workable and liveable, which sustained my forebeans, when little else at times was available. A staff to which one can cling in a troublesome, charging world.

Earlene Carmack in Ca. and Gwin Copland in Texas are busy trying to find and solve the missing links of the Carmack family.


