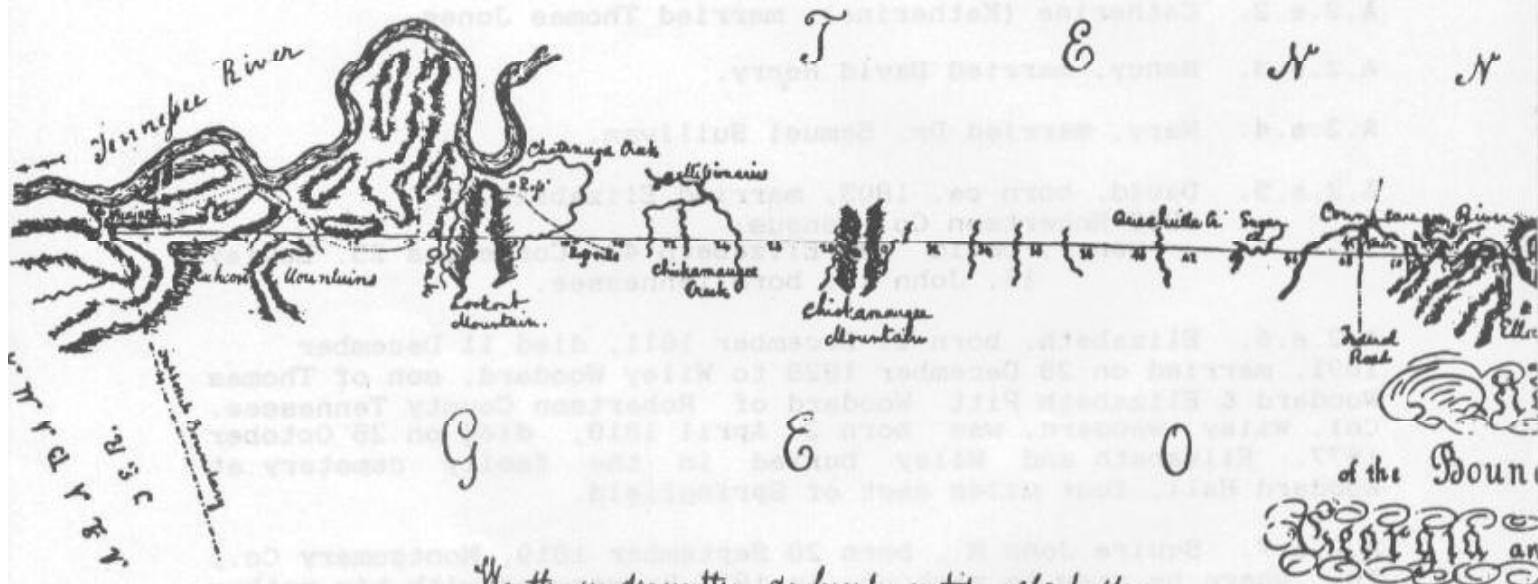

ELIZABETH CARMACK HENRY

Carmack, Elizabeth born ca. 1776 and died ca. 1864 in Robertson County, Tennessee, daughter of Cornelius Carmack born 1736, Frederick, Md., died 1824 in Overton County, Tennessee and wife Margery, see CARMACK COUSINS VOL. I, NO. 1. Elizabeth Carmack married James Henry born 1766 in Virginia and died ca. 1825.

From: "History of Kentucky", Simpson Co., 3rd. edition, dated 1886, James Henry, a native of Virginia, removed in childhood with his parent to east Tennessee, where he was reared and married: located in Montgomery County as early as 1800; was long a Methodist class leader; engaged in planting there, and died in 1825, at the age of sixty years. He was a soldier in the war of 1812 and his gun is now in the possession of Squire John M. Henry, his son. From "Sketches of Ancestry", James Henry was very industrious, and a strict Methodist.

1850 Robertson Co. Census:

Henry, David 47, Elizabeth 43, Cornelius 25, Leviey 16, John 10, born Tennessee.

A.2.e.6. Elizabeth, born 21 December 1811, died 11 December 1891, married on 28 December 1828 to Wiley Woodard, son of Thomas Woodard & Elizabeth Pitt Woodard of Robertson County Tennessee. Col. Wiley Woodard, was born 2 April 1810, died on 28 October 1877. Elizabeth and Wiley buried in the family cemetery at Woodard Hall, four miles east of Springfield.

A.2.e.7. Squire John M., born 20 September 1819, Montgomery Co., Tn., where he grew to manhood; in 1837 he removed with his mother to Robertson County, Tn. and in 1851 located on Red River, in the Southwestern portion of Simpson County, Ky., on 12 October 1841, he married Harriet V., daughter of James and Margaret Pope Woodard, of Robertson Co. Margaret born 11 October 1824. In his business career, Squire M. Henry by industry, economy and fair dealing acquired a handsome competency. He was President of the First National Bank of Franklin during the latter part of its existence, and partner in the bank of J. A. McGoodwin & Co., of Franklin. He represented Simpson County in the Legislature during the stormy period of 1861-62-63 and was magistrate and

member of the court of claims both in Robertson and Simpson Counties. Squire Henry was a successful farmer, owning nearly 1,000 acres of well-improved and productive land in good condition. He had around 2,000 fruit trees, and raised a fair amount of farm stock. He was a member of the A.F. & A.M. In politics was formerly an old ling Whig, but is now a Republican.

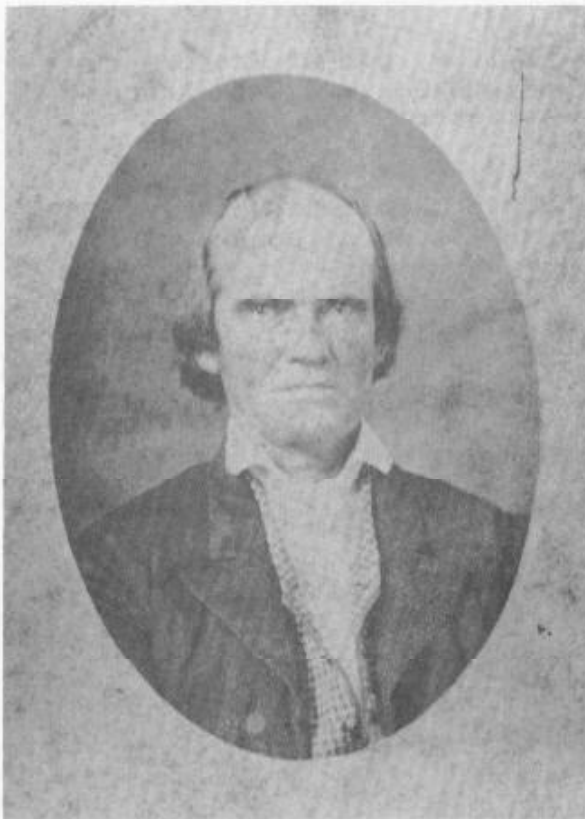

CORNELIUS GOES TO ILLINOIS

Cornelius Carmack, see Carmack Cousins, Vol. I, No. I, page 4, A.2.a.4. Son of Cornelius Carmack & Lettice of Overton Co., Tn. Cornelius moved with his family to Overton Co., Tn. around 1801, he grew up near Livingston and married Ingabo Gore there. The first five children were born in Overton Co., Tn. In 1828 he moved his family to Illinois where four more children were born. According to a grandson, Eli Carmack, they made the trip in ox-drawn wagon, Ingabo, babe-in-arms, rode a horse, driving loose cattle before her. The child she carried was Lineura, her fifth born.

Cornelius died in 1849 at the age of 55 years, 2 months, and 6 days. According to the Mortality Schedule of the 1850 U. S. Census, he died of epilepsy after 150 days of illness.
