In the Name of God Amen I John Howe of Plattsburgh in the county of Clinton State of New York being weak in body but of sound memory blessed be God doth this day in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and thirteen make this my last will and testimony in manner following that is to say

1st I give my body to the dust from whence it cam and my spirit to God who gave it

2nd I wish all my honest debts to be paid

3rd I will to my wife Lydia one horse saddle & bridle my Cutter and harness two cows and fifteen sheep and all the things that she brot when she came to live with me together with all her wearing apparel and also one half of all the bed and bedding that she has made since she has lived with me and also five notes against Leonard Greeno which he gave to my wife Lydia

4th I will to my son Ira five shilling

5th I will to my son Eri my best suit of cloths and a pair of two year old steers

6th I will to my other children Viz. Dualana Samuel Chloe Kezia John Martha Esther and Althea all the rest of my estate to be equally divided excepting my sermon book great Bible and the red chest with drawers which I will as follows the sermon book to Samuel the great Bible to John & the red chest with drawers to Kezia and I make and ordain my sons Samuel & John soul Executors of this my last will in trust for the intent and purpose contained In Witness where of I have hear unto set my land and seal this third day of January in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred thirteen John Howe Signed and sealed in the presence of David Howes and Baruch Beckwith

The will is accompanied with a statement from David Howes and Baruch Beckwith attesting to the signature. This statement is dated January 11, 1813

"There was great distress throughout the county of Clinton during the winter of 1816-17. Mr. Peter SAILLY, in a letter to the Secretary of the Treasury, under date of Jan. 24, 1817, says, "A large portion of the inhabitants are much distressed for want of bread, whilst the poorer and laboring class are absolutely destitute of means of obtaining it at the high price it sells for." The column of the REPUBLICAN bear evidence to the severity of the season. The summer was unusually cold and backward. On Thursday, the 6th day of June, the atmosphere at Plattsburgh was filled with particles of snow, and it was uncomfortable out of doors without a great-coat. In Vermont, the weather was still more severe. On Thursday "the snow fell rapidly, but melted as it fell. Much snow fell on Friday night, and on Saturday in the forenoon in many places. In Williston it was twenty, and in Cabot eighteen, inches deep. The ground at Montpelier was generally covered during the whole of yesterday (June 8th), and the

mountains, as far as can be seen, are yet completely white." [Letter published in REPUBLICAN of July 13th, dated Waterbury, Vt, June 9th.] This cold weather was succeeded by an uncommon drought. No rain fell during the months of August and September. The earth became parched, and, in clay soils, opened in large cracks; swamps were dried up, wells and brooks failed to furnish water, and the rivers became so low that the mills could not grind sufficient to answer the wants of the inhabitants. Wheat was brought to the mills of Messrs. SMITH and PLATT, in this village, to be ground, by farmers residing as far north as Lacadie, in Canada. Fires also raged throughout the county, burning up large quantities of timber, and frequently destroying pastures and meadow lands. No rain of any consequence fell until after the 10th of October. "The atmosphere," say the REPUBLICAN of October 5th, "has been so filled with smoke, arising from the fires in every direction, that even in this village, for three or four days the first of the present week, it would be difficult in the morning to distinguish a man at the distance of fifty rods.""

Mahlon Howe, Freeborn County Minnesota Pioneer, Businessman Honored by Albert Lea Community Magazine, May, 1935.

Mahlon Pitmond Howe, born October 22, 1848 in Poultney, Rutland County, Vermont. Parents: Albert Cyrus Howe, and Julia Ann Barker Howe. Parents moved to Wisconsin in 1854, settling near Lake Geneva. In 1864 they moved to Freeborn County, Minnesota, where M.P. has resided even since. He attended school winters, working summers. Attended private school and Owatonna High, obtaining a First Grade Teachers Certificate. Taught for 20 years.

Married in 1869, settled on a farm near Alden village, breaking up the prairie with oxen. Kept a hired man, taught school and later wrote New York Life Insurance in spare time and on rainy days, going on horseback over the then nearly impassible country roads. Continental State agent hearing of his insurance success, persuaded him to sign contract with the Company in 1880.

Moved to Alden village i 1907 and to Albert Lea, county seat, in 1914, where he still resides. He held township and school offices and was Mayor of Alden.

Member of the Presbyterian Church, Odd Fellows and Knights of Pythias and in younger days was also an Elk and Woodman.

M.P. is of slight build, straight as an arrow, sinewy, amiable and friendly to all, gives and takes jokes, and greets his clientele as friends rather than just patrons, many of whom are sons, daughters and grandchildren of early customers and know of the explicit faith and confidence all have in him.

Hobbies: In early days it was horsemanship. Many of the old state agents can recall the fine rides behind his high steppers so well matched, and the prizes won by some of his trotters driven by himself. Telegated to the past it is only history buried deep in Memory's Treasure Trove. Now his chief hobby is managing his 180-acre farm, rented 50-50 and trying to improve his "non-kicking crank" for autos, trucks, tractors and stationary engines, etc., on which he received his patent in 1933.

At the age of 86 1/2 years he drives his car from one end of the county to the other, re-writing his expirations, soliciting new ones and settling losses, a firm believer in, "It is better to wear out than to rust out."

The building of a large insurance business in the country was no easy task; it did not come merely for the asking. The pioneers had to be educated up to the necessity of it from the business standpoint and also to the stability and honesty of the Insurance company of which they were skeptical. Then too, the roads in this section in the early days in the spring were almost utterly impassable, mud up to the hubs and very bad after every rain. But, to this indomitable, courageous, persevering, ambitious representative, as with Caesar of Old, "There were no Alps"; when he put his hand to the plow there was no turning back; he would deliver his "Message to Garcia."

Today, the psychological effects of the financial conditions and the depression, combined with cheap mutual coverage are the big "Alps" hs is faced to combat. Many a farmer has placed his "John Hancock' on the dotted line saying, "No one but you, Howe, could have made me do this." Often it has taken a great deal of his vitality to persuade him, but what joy it gives him to have succeeded. Succeed! That has been his life-long slogan. His Johnny Bull English determination, his rugged Green Mountain character so impregnated his nature with success,

that in "his lexicon there was never such a word as fail".

A deep thinker, an ardent lover of poetry, a great student of the sciences, this representative of the good old reliable Continental that "has stood the acid test of time" still carried on and points with pride to his Gold Medal - the proof of his achievements and of his honorable career.

Eddie Claude Howe was born April 20, 1878, at Albert Lea, Minn. the son of Albert and Eliza Hendrick Howe. His only brother passed away at birth. He had 13 half-brothers and 2 half sisters.

At the age of two he moved with his parents to Mandan, N. D.; later to Tacoma, Wash and then to Billings. In Nov of 1887, he came to Hyattville and in 1899 he moved to Shell where he owned and operated a ranch on Beaver Creek until 1947 when he retired. On Oct 24, 1901, he was united in marriage with Josephine Milward. To this union were born nine children. He was preceeded in death by one daughter, Honor, who died at birth.

Mr. Howe attended school in Billings through the fifth grade. He was always interested in education and served on the Beaver creek school board and donated the land for the Lower Beaver Creek schoolhouse.

The average life expectancy in the United States was forty-seven.

Only 14 percent of the homes in the United States had a bathtub.

Only 8 percent of the homes had a telephone. A three-minute call from Denver to New York City cost eleven dollars.

There were only 8,000 cars in the US and only 144 miles of paved roads. The maximum speed limit in most cities was ten mph.

Alabama, Mississippi, Iowa, and Tennessee were each more heavily populated than California. With a mere 1.4 million residents, California was only the twenty-first most populous state in the Union.

The tallest structure in the world was the Eiffel Tower.

The average wage in the US was twenty-two cents an hour. The average US worker made between \$200 and \$400 per year. A competent accountant could expect to earn \$2000 per year, a dentist \$2500 per year, a veterinarian between \$1500 and \$4000 per year, and a mechanical engineer about \$5000 per year.

More than 95 percent of all births in the United States took place at home.

Ninety percent of all US physicians had no college education. Instead, they attended medical schools, many of which were condemned in the press and by the government as "substandard."

Sugar cost four cents a pound. Eggs were fourteen cents a dozen. Coffee cost fifteen cents a pound.

Most women only washed their hair once a month and used borax or egg yolks for shampoo.

Canada passed a law prohibiting poor people from entering the country for any reason, either as travelers or immigrants.

The five leading causes of death in the US were: 1. Pneumonia and influenza, 2. Tuberculosis, 3. Diarrhea, 4. Heart disease, 5. Stroke.

The American flag had 45 stars. Arizona, Oklahoma, New Mexico, Hawaii and Alaska hadn't been admitted to the Union yet.

Drive-by shootings--in which teenage boys galloped down the street on horses and started randomly shooting at houses, carriages, or anything else that caught their fancy--were an ongoing problem in Denver and other cities in the West.

The population of Las Vegas, Nevada was thirty. The remote desert community was inhabited by only a handful of ranchers and their families.

Plutonium, insulin, and antibiotics hadn't been discovered yet. Scotch tape, crossword puzzles, canned beer, and iced tea hadn't been invented.

There was no Mother's Day or Father's Day.

One in ten US adults couldn't read or write. Only 6 percent of all Americans had graduated from high school.

Some medical authorities warned that professional seamstresses were apt to become sexually aroused by the steady rhythm, hour after hour, of the sewing machine's foot pedals. They recommended slipping bromide--which was thought to diminish sexual desire--into the women's drinking water.

Marijuana, heroin, and morphine were all available over the counter at corner drugstores. According to one pharmacist, "Heroin clears the complexion, gives buoyancy to the mind, regulates the stomach and the bowels, and is, in fact, a perfect guardian of health."

Coca-Cola contained cocaine instead of caffeine.

Punch-card data processing had recently been developed, and early predecessors of the modern computer were used for the first time by the government to help compile the 1900 census.

Eighteen percent of households in the United States had at least one full-time servant or domestic.

There were about 230 reported murders in the US annually.
