

Eight Years, a resident of the County of Stark in the
State of Illinois, who being duly sworn according to law
declares that he is the identical Calvin Powell, who
was a private in the Company commanded by Captain
Gould Tyler, in a Regiment of Volunteers, commanded
by Colonel Samuel Blakesley, in the war with
Great Britain, declared in 1812, That he volunteered
at Batavia in the State of New York, on or about the
20th of December A.D. 1813, for no definite time, that
he continued in actual service in said war for the
term of about 18 days, and was disbanded ~~immediately~~
~~and~~, immediately after the Battle of Black Rock,
but did not receive a written discharge — That on
or about the first of March A.D. 1814, he was drafted
as a private in the Company commanded by Captain
Abram Matteson, in the Regiment of Militia, commanded
either by Colonel Hugh W Dobbie, or — Smith, (he does
not distinctly recollect which) for the term of three months,
at Williamsville in the State of New York, that he continued
in actual service in said war for the term of about one
Month, at ~~Williamsville~~ ~~on~~ ~~exercises~~, and was honorably
discharged at Williamsville aforesaid, on account of
being Mastered out of the Service, as also appears by the
Muster Rolls of said Company; that his discharge has
been destroyed; that he has never received, nor is he
entitled to any Military bounty land under any act of

eral Blakesley in the war with Great Brit-
ain, declared by the United States on the
18th of June, 1812, and that he volunteered
at Batavia, N.Y. in the month of December,
1813, for an indefinite period of time, and
continued in active service in said war
for the term of fourteen days, and was hon-
orably discharged at Williamsville - near
Buffalo, in the month of January, A.D. 1814.

And he, the aforesaid Calvin Powell, also
and further declares that he is the iden-
tical Calvin Powell who was a soldier
in the company commanded by Captain Abra-
ham Matteson, in a regiment of Regular
Infantry, commanded by — Smith, in the war
with Great Britain, declared by the United
States on the 18th of June, 1812, that he was





says that at the time he performed the Service,
^{Calvin Powell} (1812) his father was living, and he, (the affi-
ant) then signed his name as Junior, but since
his father's death he has dropped the "Junior."

But, the affiant says that he has pro-
cured the affidavits hereto annexed and
made a part of this "Additional Evidence".

And affiant further says, that in the
battle at Black Rock, in which affi-
ant was engaged, his Captain, Gould
Tyler, was killed; that the length of time since
the Service was performed by affiant, and
so many of his comrades in arms have since
died or reside in parts unknown, that
it is now nearly, if not quite impossible,
for affiant to procure evidence of his
service in addition to that now procured.

And affiant further says that his
services were paid for at the rate of eight
dollars per month, at, according to his best
recollection, Bloomingfield, in the State of New
York, by whom not recollect, further than
that it was by a pay master of the Govern-
ment.

And, finally, affiant, the aforesaid
Calvin Powell, junior, says that he is in-

able to procure any such "record evidence" as the office requires, and that he can furnish no other, different or additional evidence, than that which accompanies this affidavit.
