CALL FOR HISTORY OF CLAIMANT'S DISABILITY.

Department of the Interior,

BUREAU OF PENSIONS,

Washington, D. C., March 12, 1890

Sir:

In the claim for Invalid Pension No. 728.828.,
of French B. White, the claimant is requested to state his place or several places of residence (actual post-office addresses—in cities, the names of streets and numbers), and what his occupation has been during the period from his discharge to the present time, giving approximately the dates of any changes in his residence. He should also give a full and circumstantial history of the origin of his disability, and its continuance from the time when it first appeared, mentioning all medical treatment which he has received, and the names and residences of his physicians, and which, if any of them, are deceased. He should also state whether at any time and for what period or periods, giving dates as nearly as possible, he has been prevented from following his usual occupation by reason of the alleged disability.

Until the foregoing shall have been furnished, further action can not be intelligently taken in this claim, and a prompt reply will facilitate its early settlement.
