in the County of King and State of Washington

well known to me to be reputable and entitled to credit, and who, being duly sworn, declared in relation to aforesaid case as follows:

I am acquainted with Frank B. White since I lived a near neighbor for many years. He enlisted in the service of the Government in the same company with me in June 1863. We served in the same Co nearly three years. Said Frank B. White was taken with diarrhea in September 1863 at Lexington Va. I was with him every day and nearly every night and took care of him and I know he was very bad. In the winter of 63 & 64 we moved to point Isabel on the Cumberland River. There he was taken worse becoming so weak he could scarcely stand or walk and was left with the sick when the Co moved on to Knoxville. When he died in the spring of 64 at Knoxville ~~Tenn~~ there he was again bad with diarrhea and doctored with Doctor Livingstone in the spring and summer of 1864 and at Chattanooga Tenn in the fall 64 I remember quite well he was troubled with the same disease.
